We Steal Secrets: The Story of WikiLeaks

Screening as part of SUNDAY BEST, the ABC2 season of feature length documentaries, **We Steal Secrets: The Story of WikiLeaks** is a riveting look at Julian Assange's WikiLeaks, the controversial website which facilitated the largest security breach in U.S history.

Academy Award-winning documentary filmmaker Alex Gibney (*Taxi to the Dark Side*) details the creation of Julian Assange's controversial website WikiLeaks - which



facilitated the largest security breach in U.S. history - and traces the roots of Assange's activism. Considered a hero and a martyr by some, Julian Assange was instrumental in uncovering abuses of power such as a devastating 2007 helicopter attack in Baghdad, that killed 12 innocent people including two Reuters employees, to the release of thousands of classified State Department foreign policy documents. The issue transcends WikiLeaks into transparency and ultimately, into who controls information.

Joanna Lumley's Japan

Joanna is in Tokyo and flies over the city spanning 5420 square miles in a helicopter. Tokyo was bombed extensively during the second world war, so almost all of Tokyo has been built in the last seventy years; a symbol of Japan's post war economic boom that saw it become the world's second largest economy.

In the evening, Joanna heads out to a nightclub to see Kamem Joshi, a Japanese girl band. She watches the energetic performance and sees that the largely male audience are performing almost as much as the girls on stage. Joanna meets up with Minori, a fashion designer and internationally known artist. She wears 'Shinori' make up, meaning her face is white, similar to Geisha.

Joanna leaves the bustling city and travels to the Kiso Valley to walk the Nakasendo Way, an ancient route that once linked Tokyo to Kyoto. Arriving in Kyoto at the peak of the city's cherry blossom season, Joanna takes a tour of the city's favourite Hanami spots by taxi.

Kyoto is also best known for that most famous of Japanese traditions, the Geisha. Joanna goes to Gion, Kyoto's entertainment district, where she meets a trainee Geisha, called Maiko Tomitsuyu. She happily chats to Joanna about her world and experiences.

Heather arrives in the Victorian coastal town of Mallacoota on a century old ferry boat. Mallacoota is a remote place at the end of the road on the far eastern tip of Victoria. Heather finds that isolation has bred a determination in the town to look after its own.

Mallacoota is known for the abalone industry that's been the lifeblood of this place for 50 years. It's a lucrative business and local divers have made their fortune from harvesting the "underwater gold". She meets two brothers, second generation abalone divers Paul and Brett Menke, and takes a trip to one of their favourite dive spots.

In the summer, when the abalone season is finished, thousands of tourists flock to the foreshore and the town turns into one big camp site.

Mallacoota is renowned for its natural beauty, bordered by ocean on one side, pristine lakes and wilderness on the other.

But for the permanent residents, life in this beautiful but remote environment comes at a cost. Mallacoota is isolated from services many of us take for granted.

Heather meets Mallacoota's only GP, Dr Sara Renwick-Lau, a keen surfer who moved here for a sea change. The doctor is acutely aware of the problems that come with that isolation. She's struggling to keep her surgery afloat but the people of Mallacoota won't let it sink without a fight.

It's just one of the expected challenges facing a remote town but others have come right out of the blue. A recent tragedy on the other side of the world struck at the heart of this seaside village and the town once again rallied to look after its own.

Heather discovers Mallacoota is a place that won't be beaten.

Running Wild: Australia's Camels

Australia has the largest herd of wild camels in the world, estimated at times to have been close to one million.

First brought into the country for the ill-fated Burke and Wills expedition in the 1860's, along with their handlers who were dubbed 'Afghans', the camels are now running wild, causing havoc in the fragile desert environment.

Robyn Davidson, famous for her solo expedition across the west Australian desert by camel in the 1970s, presents this documentary telling the story of the camels, the people who brought them here, and those who are still trying to work with the camels left behind. She provides rare insight through narration and interviews, including descendents of the original Afghans who provide their own fascinating history.

Running Wild explores the recent culling operations that have killed hundreds of thousands of the wild herd, seen by many as a wasted opportunity now that camel meat and milk are a valuable commodity. It looks at how people might harness the resource, while combating the damage the wild animals wreak to the landscape.

Rick Stein: From Venice To Istanbul

Capturing the flavour of an ancient empire, chef Rick Stein embarks on a memorable odyssey through Italy, Croatia, Albania, Greece and Turkey during this new seven-part series.

Exploring the culinary legacy of the legendary Byzantine Empire, Rick uncovers its little-known history and cuisine, and relishes the food that many people associate with holidays in the eastern Mediterranean and the Adriatic – healthy, light, tasty dishes that go so well with sunshine, remote islands, chilled wine and clear, aquamarine seas.

In this entertaining survival show, UK comedian Russell Kane and an assortment of online celebrities take on extreme challenges – with only a smartphone to help them.

From hailing a cab in the early hours of the morning, to diagnosing an illness in three symptoms, our smartphones can help us overcome any practical problem. In this entertaining series, pampered city-dweller Russell Kane takes this idea to its extreme. He's attempting some of the world's toughest outdoor adventures, with no training, no guide – and his only survival tool is a mobile phone.

Each episode sees the sardonic stand-up joined by a young internet star who can consult a huge online fanbase. Together, they'll travel via dog sled to a Norwegian Sami village, transport a cow across the Moroccan desert, and take on many more arduous expeditions. They'll have to hunt, find shelter and – perhaps most testing of all – put up with each other. Our wannabe survivalists won't be completely alone; they'll be joined by the international online community.
