Don't Stop The Music

It's the last term of the year and Lee's bold new music program is now in its fourth week. Brass teacher Michelle Wilde announces that the students will have their first public performance – just 7 weeks away. But right now, the ensemble sound like howling dogs. Can the students reach anything approaching a song in that time?

In order to make diamonds you need pressure and the teething problems are becoming apparent. Cornet student Kyla has low self-confidence and can't blow a note. How will she make a concert when even blowing a raspberry is beyond her?

Euphonium player Levi has a natural talent for any musical instrument that he touches but he's not practicing. Levi has trouble with his concentration and his father is hoping that learning an instrument will give him a focus and help his school work. But Levi risks being thrown out of the music program for his lack of application. How do you keep kids like Levi motivated?

For a singer like Anastacia, who lives with a mother battling cancer and her own health issues which include Tourette's, music is a way to a better life. She clearly has the talent but will she get the opportunity? Choral maestro Micheál McCarthy steps in and arranges an audition for her that could be life-changing.

As tensions boil before their first ever performance, the kids are put under increasing pressure – it's a long way to the top...



Fresh Blood Pilot Season - Koala Man

FRESH BLOOD is a ground-breaking ABC and Screen Australia initiative that seeks to uncover the next generation of Australian comedy talent. First launched in 2013, there were hundreds of entries of from all over the country that culminated in the Wham Bam Thankyou Ma'am and Fancy Boy sketch series (both co-produced with NBCU's Seeso streaming platform (U.S.). Once again in 2017, 20 up-and-coming comedy teams were given \$15,000 each to produce a 3x5 minute comedy project. This year, four of those were chosen to produce a half hour comedy pilot, with one or possibly two projects to be commissioned to make a 6-part series.

Koala Man – the first of these four pilots - is an animated comedy series by Michael Cusack, which is part of a Screen Australia and ABC special initiative **Fresh Blood**, which seeks to find the best new voices in Australian comedy talent.

Kevin Williams is a divorced dad, in a dead-end job as an IT consultant at the local council (which is basically deleting offensive comments off the council's Facebook page). Every second weekend he gets to look after his teenage son Liam, who would rather be anywhere else than stuck at his Dad's house.

The only time Kevin feels free is when he pulls on his koala mask and becomes Koala Man, a civic superhero who wants to rid Unanderra of petty crime. The only problem is the locals think he's just a weird middle-aged man in a koala mask, who's a total nuisance.

But when vandals fill the town's new fountain with detergent, causing a soapy health and safety disaster, Koala Man finally has a chance to prove his worth by finding the culprits.

Although cracking the case of the foaming fountain sends Koala Man down a dangerous path, with locals who don't like him, and a council who take all the credit for Koala Man's detective work. And there's the mysterious Brown Snake, the super villain behind the spate of vandalism, who is hiding a lot closer than Kevin realises.

The only person who knows Koala Man's true identity is Kevin's ex-wife, Linda. But if she finds out Kevin has been wearing that damn mask again, she might cut him out of their lives for good. While Koala Man will do everything in his power to protect the town, Kevin isn't doing anything at all to save his relationship with his son. And the closer he gets to catching Brown Snake, the further it's pushing Liam away.

All four Fresh Blood pilots will be available on iview from 9.30pm Tue 20 November
