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


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### FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

### INTERVIEW WITH PLAYWRIGHT AND ACTOR MARK CRAWFORD AND DIRECTOR ASHLIE CORCORAN

**MC:** With your new job as Artistic Director at Vancouver's Arts Club, you're about to make a move opposite of Brett and Drew's: from small town to big city. What things are you looking forward to in soon-to-be urban life? And what do you think you'll miss about living in Gananogue?

**AC:** The move to Vancouver is a really personal one, and the motivation is similar to Brett and Drew – searching for a home. I am originally from BC, and my entire family lives in the Lower Mainland and on Vancouver Island. This move brings me back to them. Of course, the urban offerings of diverse food, entertainment, and arts and culture also has me excited!! I will miss Gananoque for many reasons – my gorgeous heritage home, being a 5 minute walk from the St. Lawrence River, and the incredible team at the Thousand Islands Playhouse. You just moved from a big city to a small town (Stratford) yourself. What has surprised you most by this move?

**MC:** One big surprise is how quickly you can get things done in a small town! Life generally moves at a slower pace in Stratford, but the farthest end of town is seven minutes away and there's no traffic or line-ups to deal with. I can run a bunch of errands in one hour that would take half the day in Toronto. Sticking with this theme of place... We first did this play in Gananoque, then in Montreal, and now here in Victoria. As a director, how do you think location influences a play's meaning or impacts an audience's experience?

**AC:** I love theatre because at its core, it is a conversation between performers and audience members. So yes, I've found that an audience's experiences and knowledge do change the way they engage with a piece of theatre. However, one of the reasons I adore *Bed and Breakfast* is because it is incredibly accessible; it is very human to want to find community. Therefore, while this production will have been done in three very different locations (small town Ontario, cosmopolitan Montreal, and stunning Victoria), I believe the themes resonate in each place. As a playwright, how much do you think about the location when you are writing a new work?

**MC:** I think about location a lot! Getting very specific about the location of a play helps me to be more specific about everything else: characters, dialogue, story, theme. I was recently in a production of *The Winter's Tale* which starts in the Palace of Sicilia, then moves to a sheep farm in Bohemia, and goes back to Sicilia for the end. Location has an enormous effect on every aspect of that play; moving from one place to the other changes the genre from tragedy to comedy. It was a great lesson in playwriting from that Shakespeare guy. I'm looking forward to finding out how being in Victoria influences the play and seeing how it resonates with this audience. It's truly wonderful to be here!

Paul premiered *Bed and Breakfast* at the Thousand Islands Playhouse in 2015. He co-created *The Gay Heritage Project* (Buddies in Bad Times, Toronto), which was nominated for a Dora Award for Outstanding New Play and Ensemble, and which played the Belfry in 2016. Most recently, he appeared in *Bed and Breakfast* (Centaur Theatre), *TomorrowLove* (Outside the March), *A Grand Time in the Rapids* (Thousand Islands), *Vigil* (Theatre New Brunswick), *Pig* (Buddies in Bad Times), *HAIR* (The Grand Theatre), *East of Berlin* (Tarragon Theatre and national tour), as well as seven seasons at the Stratford Festival, and appearances on *Murdoch Mysteries*, *Rogue* and *Reign*.



Ashlie Corcoran

Director

Originally from White Rock, Ashlie is the Artistic Producer of Theatre Smash, for which she has directed eight productions, as well as the Artistic Director of the Thousand Islands Playhouse, for which she has directed fifteen productions. Recently she directed Me and My Girl at the Shaw Festival, Kiss for Canadian Stage/Theatre Smash, and The Magic Flute for the Canadian Opera Company. She has also directed at the Centaur Theatre, Opera Philadelphia, Tarragon, Buddies in Bad Times, Soundstreams Canada, and Western Canada Theatre. She has been nominated twice for a Dora Mavor Moore Award. She has a BA(Hons) from Queen's University and an MA from the University of London. She is the incoming Artistic Director at the Arts Club Theatre Company.



**Dana Osborne** Set and Costume Designer

Originally from Duncan BC, Dana now resides in Stratford, Ontario, and designs for companies across Canada. Recent credits include Timon of Athens, Guys and Dolls, The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe, All My Sons (17 Seasons for Stratford Festival), Androcles and the Lion (Shaw Festival), Father Comes Home From the Wars, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead (Soulpepper), The Barber of Seville, Macbeth (Pacific Opera), Jacob Two Two and the Hooded Fang, To Kill a Mockingbird (Young People's Theatre) Boeing, Boeing, The Importance of Being Earnest and Blithe Spirit (Thousand Islands Playhouse). www.danaosborne.ca

Composer, sound designer and musician John Gzowski's theatre work has won him six Dora Mavor Moore Awards for companies such as Stratford Festival, Shaw Festival, Luminato Festival, Mirvish Productions, National Arts Centre, Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, Arts Club Theatre Company, Canadian Stage, Soulpepper, Dancemakers, Tarragon Theatre, Factory Theatre and Young People's Theatre in over 200 productions. Gzowski has played on numerous CDs, including recent releases with Patricia O'Callghan, Tasa, and Autorickshaw, as well as a Juno Award nomination with Maza Meze.

Michael makes his Belfry Theatre debut with *Bed and Breakfast*, after having stage managed this production at Centaur Theatre Company and Thousand Islands Playhouse. Earlier this year he completed his ninth season at the Canadian Opera Company with *The Magic Flute*. Other selected Toronto-area credits include the North American premiere of *Arrabal* (BASE/Marquis Entertainment), *Matilda, Rock of Ages*, and *The Sound of Music* (Mirvish Productions), *Jersey Boys* (Dancap Productions), and productions with Drayton Entertainment, Yonge Street Theatricals, and Just For Laughs.
