Cleverman

In the very near future, creatures from ancient mythology have suddenly emerged and must coexist with humans. Known as 'Hairypeople' for the matted hair covering their bodies, they have extraordinary strength, speed and longevity but are cast as social misfits and seek refuge in The Zone: a fragile community that finds strength in the brotherhood between Hairy and human.

When a series of violent, unexplained murders terrifies the city, blame for the bloodshed is pointed firmly in the direction of the Hairies. Raids mandated by the

Containment Authority – a government-funded body established to capture runaway Hairypeople - threaten the already tenuous peace within The Zone. But other mythical creatures exist in this world, terrifying creatures that can rip a person's heart out.

There is one chosen being – the Cleverman – who has the power to bring these two worlds back together and can see exactly what evil truly lies behind the attacks.

Following the mysterious death of his uncle, Koen West (Hunter Page-Lochard) becomes the new Cleverman – a young man in denial of his culture and estranged from his family – who is far from the model hero that the Hairies and people of The Zone so desperately need.

Koen's half-brother, Waruu (Rob Collins), is his antithesis. A man of culture and spirituality, Waruu battles tirelessly against the oppressive Containment Authority and his own demons. Believing himself to be the protector of his people and the natural heir to the Cleverman powers, the realisation that his heedless younger brother has been chosen threatens to destroy him.

In a world ruled by fear, hate and greed, can civilisation – and the power of the Cleverman - restore balance against known and unknown threats that stand to terrorize every species on Earth?

Revolution School

Revolution School is a four-part documentary series which investigates how to improve secondary education in Australia. The series was filmed in 2015 over the entire school year at Kambrya College, a typical public high school in Melbourne's outer south east.

The series uses fixed rig and roving cameras. It is an Australian TV first which captures the challenges, dramas and triumphs of life in an Australian high school



in a way not seen before. Kambrya is a large school, with more than 1100 students from 42 different nationalities. There are high achievers who are aiming for the stars, but also kids at risk of dropping out and others with serious behavioural difficulties and learning challenges.

As a state-funded school Kambrya takes on all comers, but it did have a big problem. In 2008 the school was ranked in the bottom 10% of schools in Victoria on Year 12 results, and principal Michael Muscat knew he had to make significant changes. The question was, what changes?

Faced with the challenge of transforming Kambrya, Michael Muscat went in search of answers and found support for his approach and guidance from Professor John Hattie, an educational statistician. Hattie is Director of the Melbourne Education Research Institute, part of the Melbourne Graduate School of Education (MGSE) at the University of Melbourne. Under the leadership of Professor Field Rickards, the Melbourne Graduate School is ranked in the top few tertiary education institutes in the world.

Hattie has spent decades number crunching the data from over 70,000 separate studies on the factors that influence how well our kids do in school. From how much TV they watch, to the amount of homework they are given, to the number of students in a classroom, Hattie has been able to come up with a definitive evidence-based ranking of nearly 200 factors influencing what truly makes a difference to student achievement.

It turns out the answers are not what we might expect. And certainly not the problems the politicians and media often focus on, such as class sizes, facilities, funding levels or testing regimes.

At Kambrya Michael Muscat looked at the evidence and decided the best way to lift the school off the bottom rung was to focus on more effective teaching and learning. It might sound simple but when you're dealing with emotional teenagers, time-poor staff, anxious parents, social media bullying and the pains of growing up, change isn't always easy.

Across the series we follow the dramatic story of how Kambrya tries to transform itself and change the lives of the kids.

Compass: Prison Chaplains (Part 3)

Chaplains inside men's and women's prisons and out in the community as offenders participate in an empowering post-release program.

More than 35,000 men and women are serving time in Australian prisons. Deprived of liberty and with an uncompromising routine, it can be a traumatic experience, even for hardened inmates. It's Prison Chaplains who are there to provide the emotional and spiritual support prisoners need.

As chaplains help offenders meet the challenges of incarceration and find meaning in their lives, they also assist some inmates to work towards a crime-free future. Fundamental to every chaplain's work is the understanding that regardless of their crimes, no prisoner is ever given up for lost.

In this episode Chaplain Kim Miller visits James who will soon be released from Lithgow Correctional Centre. Catalyst: Becoming Superhumn (Part 2)

In part two, Jordan will have to ask even more of Riley when it comes to driving. To steer a car, Riley will have to use his eyes via Jordan's headband device, so he won't be able to see oncoming obstacles. Instead, Riley will have to teach his brain to rely on another sense to navigate his course – it is a unique process called 'spatial sensing'.

Riley will have to train his brain to respond to vibrations that are transmitted from sensors on the exterior of the car, effectively swapping his sense of sight for touch. Along the way, Jordan will get help from experts at the top of their fields. They'll help him achieve his bold vision, and ask the broader questions Jordan's inventions raise: Is the day when technology gives our biology superhuman powers closer than we think? The Murder Detectives
