The Checkout Series Return

ACCC warns of increased risk of ACCC impersonators

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has issued a public warning pursuant to section 223 of the Australian Consumer Law about a likely increase in bodgy advice to consumers by scammers masquerading as a serious consumer affairs program.

The ACCC particularly advises Australians to be on the lookout for a suspicious television program called The Checkout which purports to offer advice to consumers.

Credible intelligence suggests the program may return to the ABC on Thursday April 7 at 8.00pm.

"It's not a very sophisticated operation, often using silly costumes, graphics and cute animals to distract people. But an alarming number of consumers are being hoodwinked," said ACCC Chairman Rod Sims. "The extent of the fraud might even be more serious. I can't be sure though because I can't understand a word Craig Reucassel says."

Scams like The Checkout are never a substitute for the only true source of consumer advice, the ACCC. If you think you have seen an episode of The Checkout, report it either to the ACCC via the official twitter account @acccgovau or to the TV ratings regulator OzTam.

The ACCC has also received reports that The Checkout sometimes pretends to be the ACCC in press releases. Anyone receiving such a press release should report The Checkout's misconduct widely in all forms of media.

Consumers are advised to avoid watching any program featuring presenters Julian Morrow, Kirsten Drysdale, Craig Reucassel, Zoë Norton Lodge, Ben Jenkins, Scott Abbot, Hannah May Reilly, CHOICE's Kate Browne as well as Alex Lee who has apparently been induced to leave her former role as a political reporter with BuzzFeed on false pretences.

Matilda & Me Premiere

Matilda and Me tells the story of the Australian debut of the global smash hit stage show, Matilda the Musical, and its composer Tim Minchin. With intimate access to his life, family and closest friends, the film reveals how Tim has evolved from loud-mouthed, iconoclastic comedian to Australia's most successful musical theatre export.



Through candid interviews, rare archive, glimpses into

Keeping Australia Alive: Love and Sacrifice

Fifty three-year-old Danny Hudswell has Parkinson's disease. The uncontrollable tremors limit his day-to-day life to the extent he can't even drink a cup of tea. Surgeons perform an awake craniotomy adjusting the signals of the brain to try to control his symptoms.

In Brisbane, nine-month-old Ariana has a hole in her heart that must be repaired. Her mother and father face a very difficult day, made much harder when mum's health complication forces her to seek treatment at a nearby emergency hospital.

Boigu is the most northern island in the Torres Straits and is the outer limit of our health system. This is frontier medicine, still dealing with illnesses like tuberculosis and leprosy. A machete injury comes in from Papua New Guinea and a young girl arrives with mysterious pain and swelling in both knees.

A patient is rushed to emergency in Melbourne's Alfred Hospital suffering severe internal burns after an electrical accident at work. The medical team work urgently to control his pain and save his leg.

Julia Zemiro's Home Delivery: Kerri-Anne Kennerley

Kerri-Anne Kennerley has spent 50 years on Australian television screens. She meets up with Julia back where it all began - in the Brisbane coastal suburb of Sandgate. But the house in which she grew up, built by her father's own hands, no longer stands.

Kerri-Anne describes a typical Queensland childhood, one of four children in a close-knit family, and of how she was the 'annoying' youngest sibling who always wanted to tag along with her brothers and sister.

She reveals she wanted to be in show business for as long as she can remember. Before the family had one of their own, she used to walk over the hill in her pyjamas to watch television through the electronics shop window, all the while dreaming of being on the tele herself.

Kerri-Anne and Julia then jump into a 1970s Valiant Charger to drive to a seemingly unchanged Sandgate State School.

And then it's on to Sandgate Town Hall to meet her sister, Jan, where Kerri-Anne complains of the injustice of being made to wear hand-me-down fancy dress costumes while their mother created a prize-winning masterpiece for Jan.

The town hall was also the first place Kerri-Anne ever performed in public, recreating routines by her favourite comedians, and miming to 'My Boomerang Won't Come Back' with her school friends.

They end the day at Channel 9 studios, where at the age 13, Kerri-Anne pestered her way to a television debut. She tells Julia about the highs and lows, from battling chauvinism to her long reign as daytime queen.

Hunted

In this groundbreaking factual thriller for British television, 14 British citizens are given fugitive status and go on the run. They must evade capture from some of the world's best investigators for up to 28 days. Leading the hunt is Chief Brett Lovegrove, former Head of Counter Terrorism for City of London Police, who led their response to the 7/7 bombings. He runs a team of 30 hunters carefully selected from law enforcement, military intelligence, cyber analysis, online profiling and human tracking.
