You Can't Ask That

In a world obsessed with appearance and fitting in, it's hard to imagine what it would be like to live with an extreme facial difference. In this brutally honest episode, we talk to people who face this challenge daily.

"Smash face" and "blender face" are just some of the responses to the question, 'What names did you get called?' Kiara Higgins from Brisbane recalls a particularly memorable playground incident, "I had a guy smash a coke can and say 'that's what your face looks like'. It's kinda funny".

Asked about romance, Carly Findlay, who suffers from the skin condition ichthyosis reveals, "I went on a date with this guy and he said 'don't you just wish you could change your face so you'd look a bit less hideous'".

Dean Clifford, from Brisbane talks about being discriminated against at job interviews. "I've gone for jobs that were just general admin, front counter, and they were sort of like 'well would you work in the back room because you wouldn't be a good front face'... surprisingly I didn't get that job."

Val suffered burns to 85% of her body when the light airplane that she was travelling in crashed, killing her husband. Asked if people pity her, she describes an incident with a taxi driver. "He looked at me as we drove off and he said to me 'I bet you wish you were dead'. I was just dumbfounded."
