Newton's Law

Josephine is handed the reins in a case petitioning hormone treatment for a transgender child, leaving Callum to look after Lydia. While her father rallies his troops at a bushland protest, Lydia finds herself at the controls of the developer's earthmover and unwittingly becomes a newsworthy eco-warrior with criminal charges to defend. Josephine wrangles Helena (Georgina Naidu) into briefing Lewis to defend Lydia. While Helena's terrified at the prospect of briefing a Senior Counsel, Josephine's terrified of Lewis discovering their carpark secret.



Upstairs, a highly suspicious Chambers Manager, Jackie Russo (Jane Hall), raises her misgivings about Josephine to Chambers boss Eric Whitley (Andrew McFarlane) but his attention is firmly elsewhere.

Ice Wars

Australia has a problem with Crystal Methamphetamine. Street name: Ice.

Ice Wars is a four-part series exploring the fall out and community response to one of the most popular and dangerous drugs of our time, crystal methamphetamine, also known as ice. The program makers had unprecedented access to NSW Police front line operations in metropolitan as well as rural and remote communities. The program reveals the scale and scope of the challenges facing law enforcement, health workers, users, families, and the community as they grapple to mitigate the effects of ice use in Australia.

Small towns feel the effects of social dislocation caused by desperate ice users. In Nowra an astonishing percentage of drivers test positive for methamphetamines at random roadside drug testing, and in Lismore a dealer is arrested with a trove of crystal meth. Anthony Mundine visits his hometown of Wellington to see the effect ice is having on the community - the local area police catch a dealer with drugs on them but will it be enough to secure a conviction?

Julia Zemiro's Home Delivery

A documentary series in which the playful and entertaining Julia Zemiro walks notable people down memory lane. Each episode begins with Julia and her companion driving back to their old stomping ground. They travel through time, all the while talking about life's big questions including the past, present and future.

This series features revealing and surprising interviews with actor Sam Neill, Olympian Cathy Freeman, musicians Kasey Chambers and Colin Hay, media heavyweights Lee Lin Chin and Annabel Crabb, former journo and current senator Derryn Hinch, academic Susan Carland and comedians Tim Ferguson and Ronny Chieng. Julia travels from South Australia to Far North Queensland, from Dunedin to Singapore.

Julia is an interviewer of great charm, wit and depth. She puts her guests at ease with her genuine curiosity and warmth, and they respond by opening up and sharing parts of their lives not usually revealed.

Each trip back in time is as different as the guests themselves. Some can't wait to walk through the door of a place that will always feel like home, some want to run away, and for others the family home is where Mum and Dad still live now. Walking the corridors of a former school brings up happy memories for many, while others step with trepidation through hallways that are full of ghosts. For all of them, returning to the scenes of their formative years is a powerful experience, sometimes overwhelmingly joyous, sometimes bittersweet.

Stop Laughing... This Is Serious

Tonight's final episode looks at the eclectic genre of variety. Performers like Graham Kennedy, Bert Newton and Norman Gunston dominated, serving up a mix of comedy, live sketches and music. In this episode we chart the cultural juggernaut that was Hey Hey It's Saturday, chart its idiocentricities and reveal some of today's stars who got their start on the uniquely Australian phenomenon that was Red Faces.

We search for the roots of Australian variety and find it in the Tivoli circuit that dominated Australian entertainment for over sixty years. This episode also examines the resurgence of circus in the late 1970s and the colourful and subversive television programs like The Norman Gunston Show and The Big Gig.

We look at the early work of Andrew Denton in Blah, Blah, Blah and The Money or The Gun and discover Australia's love of anti-authoritarianism. We track the evolution of the variety genre – from cultural institutions like Club Buggery, The Sideshow and Rove Live, to the late night revolution driven by sketch comedians in The Late Show and Tonight Live with Steve Vizard.

Variety has been uniquely placed as a platform to showcase stand-up comedians like Dave Hughes, Celia Pacquola and Hamish & Andy, enabling them to hone their craft and gain national attention. In this episode we mine the fertile ground of the variety genre and the collision of comedy in all its guises.
