Subject: Executive Order 2025-05: FY26 Budget Reserves Follow Up

Pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order 2025-05 to prepare the State for the economic and fiscal impact of the federal government's H.R. 1 (Public Law 119-21), I am providing a list of specific FY26 General Funds reserve targets to help address the impact on the State's budget from the law and related economic uncertainty. Approved reserve amounts, identified after a careful review by Governor's Office of Management and Budget (GOMB) staff, are included in the table below.

While not all State Agencies are directed to reserve specific amounts from their Fiscal Year 2026 General Funds appropriations, GOMB strongly encourages continued responsible fiscal management by each State Agency as we navigate continued economic uncertainty and additional spending pressures. Governor Pritzker, the Governor's office, and GOMB are working hard on his recommended Fiscal Year 2027 budget for release next month, and the outlook for Fiscal Year 2027 has not changed significantly since last fall. We expect that most agencies will not see their funding requests fulfilled – and continued fiscal management in Fiscal Year 2026 will help ensure the ability of the State Agencies to face the challenges expected over the next few years. Prioritizing and limiting hiring and other operational expenditures will be key.

Governor Pritzker remains committed to responsible fiscal management. A balanced budget is and will continue to be the Governor's top priority.

Thank you for your continued support of the Governor's mission to provide strategic investments that serve the people of Illinois while prioritizing our continued commitment to fiscal stability and a balanced budget.
