

Announcing Mercy Ships' newest ship, its second purpose-built vessel to join the fleet of the world's largest civilian hospital ships. The state-of-the-art floating hospital will further expand the organization's capacity to provide free surgeries and training, allowing even more people to receive life-changing hope and healing. By adding a new custom-designed vessel to its fleet, Mercy Ships will be able to better answer the growing need in sub-Saharan Africa, where 93% of the population currently can't access safe, affordable, and timely surgical care. Made possible by the generous support of key partners like the MSC Group and MSC Foundation, the new ship will further Mercy Ships' mission of coming alongside African nations to create sustainable change long into the future.

Built in collaboration with highly respected maritime professionals from around the world, the new ship will keep efficiency and sustainability at the forefront.

> Ship systems provide **reliable** and **efficient power, clean water**, and **air conditioning** for the hospital and crew.

> Modern, efficient systems **reduce total** energy consumption.



BUILT TO TRAIN

Using the ship as a platform for education, training, and advocacy Mercy Ships will continue to focus on long-term, sustainable surgical education, working to create lasting impact by increasing surgical capacity in partner nations. To facilitate this, the new ship will feature dedicated training spaces, classrooms, and a simulation lab that will allow trainers to simulate local conditions in order to teach relevant best practices. Built to train, with similar specifications to her sister ship the *Global Mercy*, the new vessel will enable us to accelerate our training capacity and ensure that a tangible difference can be made to strengthen healthcare systems long after the ship sails away.








Hospital Area: approximately 7,000 m2
