RUSSELL CROWE | Director, Writer and "JAKE FOLEY"

RUSSELL CROWE is an Academy Award[®] winner who is regarded as one of the finest actors of our time. Crowe's many acting honors include three consecutive Best Actor Oscar[®] nominations for his work in the acclaimed 1999 drama THE INSIDER; the 2000 Best Picture winner GLADIATOR, for which he took home the Oscar; and Best Picture winner A BEAUTIFUL MIND in 2001.

In addition to the Academy Award, Crowe's performance as Maximus, the Roman general-turned-gladiator, in Ridley Scott's GLADIATOR earned him Best Actor honors from several critics' organizations, including the Broadcast Film Critics and London Film Critics Circle. He also received Golden Globe, BAFTA and Screen Actors Guild nominations for his performance.

The year prior, Crowe obtained his first Oscar nomination for his portrayal of tobacco company whistle-blower Jeffrey Wigand in Michael Mann's THE INSIDER. He was awarded Best Actor by the Los Angeles Film Critics Association, Broadcast Film Critics Association, National Society of Film Critics and the National Board of Review. He garnered Golden Globe, BAFTA, and SAG nominations the same year.

Crowe's masterful portrayal of Nobel Prize winner John Forbes Nash, Jr. in Ron Howard's A BEAUTIFUL MIND brought him his third Oscar nomination, as well as his third consecutive Critics' Choice Award. He took home the Golden Globe, BAFTA and SAG Award, and several other critics groups Awards for Best Actor. In 2005, Crowe reunited with Howard in Cinderella Man, and his portrayal of Jim Braddock earned him both Golden Globe and SAG nominations and won him the Australian Film Institute (AFI) Award for Best Actor.

Crowe made his directorial debut in 2015 with the sweeping epic THE WATER DIVINER, in which he also starred. The film won three Australian Academy of Cinema and Television Arts Awards, including Best Picture.

He stars opposite Zac Efron in THE GREATEST BEER RUN EVER, directed by Peter Farrelly, and recently wrapped production on KRAVEN THE

HUNTER for Sony. He is currently filming THE POPE'S EXCERTIST for Screen Gems.

Additional film credits include Taika Waititi's THOR LOVE AND THUNDER; Solstice's psychological thriller UNHINGED; Justin Kurzel's TRUE HISTORY OF THE KELLY GANG with George MacKay; Universal's THE MUMMY opposite Tom Cruise; Joel Edgerton's BOY ERASED with Nicole Kidman and Lucas Hedges; THE NICE GUYS with Ryan Gosling; Darren Aronofsky's biblical drama NOAH; Gabriele Muccino's FATHERS AND DAUGHTERS; Akiva Goldsman's WINTER"S TALE; Zack Snyder's MAN OF STEEL; Tom Hooper's acclaimed screen adaptation of the musical LES MISERABLES; and Allen Hughes' BROKEN CITY. He has worked on several Ridley Scott-directed projects such as A GOOD YEAR, AMERICAN GANGSTER, BODY OF LIES and ROBIN HOOD. Among his other credits are Peter Weir's MASTER AND COMMANDER: THE FAR SIDE OF THE WORLD for which he earned a Golden Globe nomination; Taylor Hackford's PROOF OF LIFE; 3:10 TO YUMA, with Christian Bale; Kevin Macdonald's STATE OF PLAY, with Ben in RZA's THE MAN WITH THE IRON FISTS.

On the television side, Crowe received rave reviews for his performance as Roger Ailes in the Stan Exclusive Series THE LOUDEST VOICE, starring opposite Naomi Watts and Sienna Miller. He won the Golden Globe for Best Actor in a Mini-Series or Motion Picture for TV and received SAG and Critics Choice award nominations.

Born in New Zealand, but raised in Australia it was there Crowe gained international attention for his work on the big screen. He was recognised three consecutive years by the AFI, starting in 1990, when he was nominated for Best Actor for THE CROSSING; in 1991 when he won Best Supporting Actor for PROOF and the following year winning the Best Actor Awards from both the AFI and the Australian Film Critics for his performance in ROMPER STOMPER. The 1993 Seattle International Film Festival not only named him Best Actor for his work in ROMPER STOMPER but in HAMMERS OVER THE ANVIL too. Crowe's American film debut was in Sam Raimi's 1995 western, THE QUICK AND THE DEAD and later went on to earn acclaim for his role in Curtis Hanson's crime drama L.A CONFIDENTIAL.

His early film credits include MYSTERY, ALASKA, HEAVEN'S BURNING, VIRTUOSITY, THE SUM OF US, FOR THE MOMENT, LOVE IN LIMBO, THE SILVER BRUMBY, THE EFFICIENCY EXPERT and PRISONERS OF THE SUN. Crowe has since starred in a long and diverse list of film and television credits capturing audiences worldwide.



KEITH RODGER | Producer

Keith is an award-winning producer who has worked in film, television, music, technology, and event production for more than 30 years.

He is the Managing Director of production houses Fear of God Films and 98; his partnerships with Oscar-winning actor, producer and director Russell Crowe.

Keith's recent producer credits include the multiaward-winning Australian film and AACTA Best Picture, THE WATER DIVINER, along with FATHERS AND DAUGHTERS and ROBIN HOOD.

He is the Chairperson of The Australian Academy of Cinema and Television Arts | Australian Film Institute, a Founder and Director of The Pacific Bay Resort Studios and Village in Coffs Harbour, New South Wales, Australia, and an active member of the Producers Guild of America (PGA).

GARY HAMILTON is a world-renowned film producer whose career in the arts and entertainment industry spans over 30 years of ingenuity, proactive dedication and international success. Screen International named Mr. Hamilton as one of the most influential people in the private sector of the Australian film industry and Encore magazine placed him among Australia's top producers.

Hamilton has recently produced and licensed the critically acclaimed sci-fi thriller POSSESSOR starring Andrea Riseborough, Christopher Abbott, Sean Bean and Jennifer Jason Leigh, directed by Brandon Cronenberg, which premiered in competition at the Sundance Film Festival and was released in the US by NEON; the riveting HOTEL MUMBAI starring Dev Patel, Nazanin Boniadi, Anupam Kher and Jason Isaacs, directed by Anthony Maras which had its world premiere at Toronto International Film Festival and was released in the US by Bleecker Street; and the Academy Award® nominated FIRST REFORMED from writer/director Paul Schrader, starring Ethan Hawke and Amanda Seyfried, released in the US by A24. Hamilton's recent producing credits also include the true-life prison break story ESCAPE FROM PRETORIA starring Daniel Radcliffe and the successful biopic JUNGLE starring Daniel Radcliffe, both released in the US by eOne.

Celebrating its 20-year anniversary in 2022, Arclight Films, is the award-winning feature film production and sales company helmed by Hamilton. With a focus on medium to high budget theatrical films, the company has a library of over 300 titles including films produced by Hamilton. AARON McLISKEY | Director of Photography

AaronMcLiskyisanaward-winningcinematographer actively working across television drama, feature films, music videos and commercials.

Aaron shot the third and second seasons of acclaimed television drama MR. INBETWEEN (dir. Nash Edgerton, 2019) for BLUE TONGUE FILMS, JUNGLE ENTERTAINMENT, FOXTEL and FX. The series received multiple AACTA Award nominations as well as international critical acclaim, with many critics praising Aaron's cinematography.

Other television credits include the third season of the hit Australian drama GLITCH (dir. Emma Freeman/ MATCHBOX PICTURES/ ABC/ NETFLIX, 2019) and the third season of the beloved comedy drama THE FAMILY LAW (dir. Ben Chessell/ MATCHBOX PICTURES, 2018).

Aaron's bold and distinctive visual style is exhibited in a number of short films, including the award-winning NURSERY RHYMES (dir. Tom Noakes, 2018) for which Aaron received the Flickerfest Award for Best Cinematography; as well as THE

SAND THAT ATE THE SEA (dir. Matthew Thorne, 2018) which won Aaron the Silver ACS Award for Best Cinematography in a Short Film.

Aaron has recently completed shooting the teen horror film, TALK TO ME, for directors Danny and Michael Philippou and Causeway Films.

HUGH BATEUP | Production Designer

Hugh entered the film industry in 1981 as a construction laborer on the Australian film THE MAN FROM SNOWY RIVER. After nine years working in construction teams on various Australian TV shows and feature films, Hugh started art directing in 1989, and over a 10-year period was the art director on over 15 Australian and foreign films such as MURIEL'S WEDDING, ANGEL BABY, COSI and THE MATRIX.

Following years of success Hugh stepped up to be Supervising Art Director for THE MATRIX RELOADED, MATRIX **REVOLUTIONS** SUPERMAN RETURNS. Hugh's first Production Design assignment was CLOUD ATLAS for directors Lana and Andy Wachowski and Tom Tykwer. Hugh along with Uli Hanisch received the German LOLA for Best Production Design in 2013. Continuing his relationship with the Wachowski's, Hugh has made 2 seasons of SENSE8 for Netflix. Among many career highs, the opportunity to work with Jaume Collet-Serra on the great scary movie THE SHALLOWS has been a highlight. "I have been very fortunate that the path that I have ended taking was not one which I set out on, but it's a great adventure along the way and I have been given some great opportunities to help make some great art and entertainment".

Lynne was born and raised in Australia and has had the opportunity to work internationally for the last 25 years on some of the largest and most inspiring projects as Designer, Key, Personal Makeup and Hair alongside award-winning and high-profile designers and cast.

She has worked as a Makeup Artist for feature films such as HACKSAW RIDGE, SUPERMAN RETURNS, PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN: DEAD MAN NO TALES, THE RAILWAY MAN, INTERCEPTOR and is currently working on the 2022 film WIZARDS featuring Pete Davidson and directed by David Michod.

Gypsy Taylor is an award-winning Australian Designer and Illustrator whose 25-year career spans feature and short films, TV series, commercials, theatre, immersive experiences and animation.



Gypsy was also Assistant Costume Designer on THE WOLVERINE and storyboard assistant for Shaun Tan's Academy Award winning short film, THE LOST THING. In publishing, her illustrations have been featured in 17 volumes of the beloved children's book series, PEARLIE.

After graduating with a Bachelor of Design from NIDA in 1994, Gypsy worked as Catherine Martin's Costume Design Assistant & Illustrator on Baz Luhrmann's AUSTRALIA, ALEXANDER THE GREAT, and CHANEL NO.5 IT'S THE ONE THAT I WANT, as well as Catherine's homewares range.

In 2016, Gypsy won the Streamy Award for Costume Design on OSCAR'S HOTEL FOR FANTASTICAL CREATURES. Other nominations include Best Scenic Design at the Helpmann Awards for Shaun Tan's THE RED TREE and Best Illustration at the Australian Production Designers Guild Awards for THE CHRONICLES OF NARNIA: THE VOYAGE OF THE DAWN TREADER.






One of Australia's most highly regarded television presenters, Daniel has hosted seven series of DANCING WITH THE STARS as well as the first season of X-FACTOR AUSTRALIA, and in 2017 Daniel hosted the International AACTA Awards in Los Angeles for Foxtel Arts.

Recipient of the TV WEEK Logie Award for Most Popular New Talent in 1999, Daniel has since twice been nominated for the Silver Logie for Most Popular Actor, as well as Best Newcomer at the British National Television Awards. In 2008, GQ Magazine named Daniel as Australia's Most Popular Television Personality.

On stage, Daniel alternated the roles of Jesus and Judas in the musical GODSPELL, which played in London and the UK, and starred opposite Edward Woodward in THE MYSTERIES at London's Canterbury Cathedral. In 2013, Daniel was part of the all-star Australian cast of 8 THE PLAY.

Daniel is a six-time Ironman finisher and has represented Australia at Olympic, Half Ironman and Ironman distance Triathlon World Championships. He has run multiple endurance events to raise money and awareness for charities such as World Vision, Reclink, Charity: Water, and The Indigenous Marathon Project, for which he is an ambassador.









PAUL TASSONE | VICTOR

As an actor, writer and director, Paul has had an indelible career in theatre, film and television.

After completing a BA in Theatre and Drama from Murdoch University, Paul launched his professional career in 1992 with KARAGIOZIS DOWN UNDER for the Deckchair Theatre Company. As an actor, his theatre credits have since included MY LOVE PLAYS for Bastard Amber Theatre, ESCAPADES for Umbrella Theatre Company, THE LIFT for the Festival of Perth, David Williamson's THE CLUB for Effie Crump Theatre, Stephen Sewell's BURIED and Buzo's SLAM DUNK, both for the Black Swan Theatre Company, as well as Moira Buffini's SILENCE at the Enmore Theatre. Paul also cowrote and performed in the WA Youth Theatre Company's production of OBSESSIONS. 2017 also saw Paul star in the World Premiere of Dan Lee's GREY NOMAD for the Australian Theatre Company in Los Angeles.

In 1994, Paul joined Insomniac Productions in Italy for their tour of THE LIFT and then settled in London to study at the famed Lee Strasberg Institute.

Making his television debut in the 1993 ABC TV drama SECRETS, starring Rachel Griffiths, the following year Paul co- hosted the afternoon show THE BUZZ and wrote and starred in the short film DECAFFEINATED. That year, the film won Best Film and Paul won Best Actor at The WA Film and Video Festival. Following starring roles in two SBS short films, Paul was cast in Network Ten's sports teen drama SWEAT, playing the core cast role of Don "THE DON" Majors opposite Heath Ledger and Martin Henderson.

More television roles followed with ALL SAINTS (two different roles in two years), WATER RATS, the Kingswood Country sequel BULLPIT, the telemovie MUMBO JUMBO and roles in the USA Telemovies FIRST DAUGHTER, SILENT PREDATORS AND AIRTIGHT. Paul was next cast in the recurring role of Eddie Bird in the ABC TV series LOVE IS A FOUR LETTER WORD.

Cast as the main role of Nelson Curtis on Australia's top rating drama ALL SAINTS for Channel Seven, Paul starred in the show for five years. Upon leaving, he starred as Moses in the critically acclaimed low budget film MEN'S GROUP. He was instrumental to the success of the film, which was awarded Best Film, Best Screenplay and Best Actor at the 2008 FilmInk Awards.

The following year saw Paul invited to join the cast of Channel Seven's HOME AND AWAY as the series regular Reverend Hall, as well as a role in the Oscar nominated short, THE GROUND BENEATH. He played the lead role of crooked cop Dennis Kelly in Nine Network's UNDERBELLY THE GOLDEN MILE, before going on to roles in Nine's RESCUE SPECIAL OPS, Seven's PACKED TO THE RAFTERS AND CITY HOMICIDE and Nine's telemovie PANIC AT ROCK ISLAND.

Now residing in the US, Paul's most recent work includes Andy King in the critically acclaimed mini-series THE CODE, the films SOUNDWAVE and THOSE LEFT BEHIND, NCIS and the festival hit CONCEALED, in which Paul won Best Actor In A Supporting Role at the 2016 Sydney Indie Film Festival. As a writer and director Paul has won numerous awards for his corporate film work.



director. In 2007, Nable wrote and played the lead in Paramount Pictures' first Australian acquisition - the critically acclaimed THE FINAL WINTER. Also in 2014, he worked alongside Ewan McGregor in SON OF A GUN. 2016 saw Nable in the Mel Gibson directed feature HACKSAW RIDGE and INCARNATE alongside Aaron Eckhart and in 2017 in JASPER JONES alongside Hugo Weaving and Toni Collette. 2018 saw the Australian release of 1% in which he stars and wrote. Last year saw the release of the Robert Conolly directed drama THE DRY to phenomenal success in the box office.

On the small screen, Nable starred as Travis in the third season of the international award-winning Australian drama, EAST WEST 101. He also played Detective Sergeant Gary Jubelin in the fifth instalment of the critically acclaimed Australian series UNDERBELLY: BADNESS. Nable then starred

as the lead, Jock Ross, in the gritty, six-part series about the war between two of Australia's most notorious biker gangs, BIKIE WARS: BROTHERS IN ARMS. 2015 saw Nable in the third season of US ratings success ARROW as Ra's al Ghul, the Australian series WINTER as Jack Harris and the television mini-series GALLIPOLI.

In 2016 he was seen in the US television series QUARRY, ARROW SEASON 4, LEGENDS OF TOMORROW and the Australian mini-series BARRACUDA, with his performance as swimming coach "Frank Torma" garnering him an AACTA nomination, as well as the television drama HYDE & SEEK with Nable as the lead. He appeared in the Seven Network mini-series BLUE MURDER: KILLER COP as well as MR INBETWEEN series 1 and 2. He was recently seen in the ABC/BBC series WAKEFIELD, South Pacific Pictures/Shaftesbury"s co-production THE SOUNDS and again in MR INBETWEEN Series 3, for which Nable garnered another AACTA nomination and can currently be seen in THE TWELVE.

Nable has also published three books with Penguin: "We Don't Live Here Anymore", "Faces in the Clouds" and "Guilt". His most recent book "Still" for Hachette is now a number one Australian bestseller. Nable's script for the Stan Original Film TRANSFUSION has recently completed post-production, with Matt making his directorial debut and starring opposite Sam Worthington.



Molly Grace is a young Australian born actress based in Melbourne.

Molly's screen presence and impressive work ethic helped her secure an agent at just 12 years of age. Molly consistently delivers powerful, nuanced performances. She has strong natural instincts, but her professionalism drives her to expand her emotional range and to strive for consistently compelling and truthful delivery.

Prior to POKER FACE, Molly worked with one of her acting heroes when she played the younger version of a tortured cellist played by Allison Williams (Get Out, Girls) in the Richard Shepard (Dom Hemingway, The Matador, Girls) film, THE PERFECTION. Learning to play the Cello in three weeks was a huge challenge and Molly admits to being incredibly in awe of the professional players. Molly also features in both sequels TO ALL THE BOYS I'VE LOVED BEFORE 2 and 3. Other notable credits are THE AFTERMATH and THE LAST OF US: WINTER.

Besides acting, Molly belts out anything musical theatre, plays piano, paints and dances like no one is watching! She also plays the ukulele and is often found in her room rocking out to Riptide.... Molly's main goal is to work on challenging projects, with talented and diverse artists. She can't imagine life without acting. She just loves it.
