

### FROM THE **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

Welcome again to the theatre. This production has been a partnership with the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre as a joint production (aka co-production). What exactly is a joint production? The Belfry, like many theatres across the country, will partner with a like-minded theatre company to produce a show, allowing us to share costs such as the construction of the set, costumes and props, and rehearsal time.

While the decision to work with another theatre is based on artistic considerations first, it also has a beneficial outcome for budget. In order to balance a season financially, many factors and risks are taken into account. Costs of each production include the number of cast and creative artists, accommodations for artists from away and sets, costumes etc. Knowing that ticket revenues will only account for 35% to 40% of required revenues for an average season, joint productions provide an additional avenue to balance the expense of a season.

These partnerships also allow for our work to be seen by audiences from across the country. In the past few years we have had the privilege of partnering with companies in Ottawa, Vancouver, Calgary, and Winnipeg. We are pleased to again partner with a Winnipeg based theatre, and to welcome their new Artistic Director to direct a production for us for the first time.


### ACTING COMPANY

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

### Kat Sandler Playwright

Kat Sandler is a playwright, director, screenwriter and Artistic Director of Theatre Brouhaha in Toronto. She has staged sixteen of her original plays in the last eight years, including the concurrent double bill of *The Party* and *The Candidate* this past April, where the same cast raced back and forth between spaces at the Citadel theatre to perform in two simultaneous plays each night. Her play, *Mustard* (seen last season at the Belfry) won the Dora Mavor Moore Award for Best New Play, and *Bang Bang* was nominated for the same award. She was the recipient of NOW Magazine's Audience Choice Awards for Best Director and Best Playwright, the Summerworks Spotlight Award, and was the winner of the Austin Film Fest Award for Best Fiction Podcast for *How to Build a Fire*. Kat is a graduate of the Queen's University Drama Program.



### Kelly Thornton Director

Kelly is the new Artistic Director of Royal Manitoba Theatre
Centre. Previously, she ran Nightwood Theatre in Toronto, where she
directed Unholy, Refuge, Free Outgoing, The Penelopiad, Between the
Sheets, Bear With Me, Happy Woman; as well as The List, That Face and
Wild Dogs (all in association with Canadian Stage), The Danish Play
(NAC, Aveny-Teatret, Copenhagen; Magnetic North), Finding Regina

### Smartphones, Cameras and Recording Devices

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

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

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
