Kirriwirri to Kununurra: a Selection of Kimberley Artworks from the DAA Collection

Rarely-seen Kimberley Artworks to be displayed at ABC Perth studios

ABC Perth and the WA Department of Aboriginal Affairs will exhibit rarely seen Aboriginal artworks and objects from the Kimberley region of north western WA. *Ngurra, Ngarranggarni. Kirriwirri to Kununurra: a Selection of Kimberley Artworks from the DAA Collection* will be on public display for the first time at the ABC's East Perth studios as part of Open House Perth on Saturday 12 November.

The DAA's art collection is comprised of diverse and significant Aboriginal artworks and artefacts from communities across WA and is not usually accessible to the public. *Ngurra, Ngarranggarni. Kirriwirri to Kununurra: a Selection of Kimberley Artworks from the DAA Collection*, is a small but vibrant selection of works and objects from the Kimberley region, and provides audiences with a glimpse into the living contemporary practice of some of WA's prized artists.

Artists include Nada Rawlins, Queenie McKenzie and Paddy Carlton; with thanks to Mangkaja Arts (Fitzroy Crossing), Warmun Arts (Warmun) and Waringarri Arts (Kununurra) for their input and communication with the artists.

The exhibition at the ABC Studios, 30 Fiedler St East Perth, will be open to the public on Saturday 12 November, 2016, 10am – 4pm for [Open House Perth Day](#).

The artworks will remain on display until February 28, 2017 for viewing by ABC guests or visitors attending private events, such as such as Dmitry Krymov Laboratory's Opus No. 7 which is being held as part of PIAF 2017 in the ABC Studios during February.
