Anzac Day

On Anzac Day the ABC will have comprehensive broadcast coverage of all the commemorations, from local marches in towns and cities across Australia to the battlefields of Gallipoli and Villers-Bretonneux.

From 4.25am AEST, ABC will broadcast the ANZAC Dawn Service from Sydney, followed by the ANZAC Dawn Service from Canberra at 5.30am. From 6am, join ABC News Breakfast hosts and ABC reporters at dawn services across Australia as the nation wakes up to the anniversary of the Gallipoli landings.

Anzac Day marches in each capital city will be broadcast in every state and territory on ABC, while on ABC News 24 viewers can watch the Anzac Day National Ceremony from the Australian War Memorial.

Following the local marches, the TV simulcast will continue with coverage of the dawn service from Anzac Cove in Gallipoli at 12.30pm on ABC and the dawn service from Villers-Bretonneux from 1.30pm.

Todd Sampson's Life On the Line

Putting his faith in the science of buoyancy, Todd Sampson ties himself to a giant cluster of helium balloons in an attempt to defy gravity.

With the help of astrophysicist Dr Lisa Harvey-Smith, Todd takes flight with 130 balloons to demonstrate the upward force of buoyancy. Filled with more than 87 cubic metres of helium, the second lightest gas in the universe, Todd's cluster of balloons should displace enough air to lift him into the sky. But this giant airship relies on calm conditions, and high winds threatens to derail the experiment.

Far from commercial aircraft corridors in rural Kangaroo Valley, NSW, the team get ready for what is believed to be the first ever cluster balloon flight in Australia. Todd trusts his life in the physics of buoyancy to not only give him lift off, but to also prevent him from crashlanding back to Earth.

You Can't Ask That

What's it like to kill a human being?

How messed up are you from war?

Do you think civilians are all naive idiots?

'I don't feel sorry for you because you go and kill people'. This is a sentiment commonly heard by people returning from war. In this eye-opening, moving and at times shocking episode, recent war veterans tell what it's really like to go to war.

Keiron Sewell, of Melbourne, describes why he joined, "I got tricked with the recruiting video. Showing people playing water polo, swimming and riding bicycles, having fun in the sun. And then you get there and the first 6 months is just hardcore running up hills, people screaming into your ear."

Ex-Sergeant Michael Lyddiard shares the moment his life changed forever. "We got a call an IED had been found. My number 2 and I went up and did what we needed to do but it blew up in my face." Michael's accident resulted in him losing his right arm, all but three fingers on his left arm and his right eye.

On transitioning back into civilian life, Steve McCrohon from Brisbane, talks about his marriage breakdown. "She said to me, 'You came from overseas a different person. Much harder. Much angrier'."

When presented with the question 'What's it like to kill a human being?', reactions vary. Steve says "It's not always about shooting and killing someone" and Andrew Fox-Lane responds "I consider myself lucky, because I don't know", while Brad Fewson of Wagga Wagga says it's "part of the job" but that there are "probably two that I regret". All agree that it's their most hated question to be asked, "That's probably the worst question you could ask anyone" says Keiron.

River

Stellan Skarsgård (*The Girl with The Dragon Tattoo*) stars as John River, a respected police officer haunted by the murder victims whose secrets he must uncover. He is also a man whose vulnerabilities and eccentricities are brought to the fore as he grieves the loss of a dear friend (Nicola Walker) (*Last Tango in Halifax*).

The stages of his grief mark River's growing bonds with those he has excluded from his heart and mind, and when a murder suspect jumps to his death whilst being pursued by River, he comes under increasing pressure both from the press and within the police force as calls for his dismissal grow.

As the investigation into Jackie's murder starts to reveal her deepest secrets, River has to question everything he thought he knew about his one true friend. Their relationship might have survived her death, but can it survive the truth of who she really was in life?
