Stargazing Live

Over three consecutive nights, renowned physicist, Professor Brian Cox and much-loved presenter Julia Zemiro are joined by a cast of Australia's leading scientists and some familiar faces to inspire the nation to 'look up' and appreciate the unique wonders of our cosmos.

Broadcasting live from the Siding Spring Observatory, Australia's premier optical and infrared astronomical



observatory, Professor Cox will lead a breathtaking journey through space using stateof-the-art technology and interacting live with viewers.

Professor Cox will look at the *Milky Way* (episode 1), *Planets* (episode 2) and *Aliens* (episode 3) tackling questions such as what happens if you're sucked into a Black Hole, and do aliens exist? Throughout the series, audiences will be invited to join an online experiment to discover a brand new planet, far outside the confines of our solar system.

Professor Cox will be joined by experts including CSIRO astrophysicist Dr Lisa Harvey-Smith; astronomer Greg Quicke; Indigenous Australian Michael Anderson who will share some of the ancient wisdoms of his Peoples' connection to the universe; and 'Citizen Science' advocate Dr Chris Lintott. Joining the experts are familiar faces including comedian Josh Thomas and *Gardening Australia*'s Costa Georgiadis.

You Can't Ask That

Series two of the thought-provoking and stereotype busting, the ABC original series **You Can't Ask That** returns on ABC and ABC iview.

Providing a platform for marginalised and misunderstood Australians to answer anonymous online questions with dignity and depth, **You Can't Ask That** hit a cord with viewers, when it aired last year.

You Can't Ask That confronts prejudice and discrimination in a highly entertaining format, offering genuine insight into the lives of Australians who live with labels, whose days are filled with the sidelong glances and silent disapproval of others: blind people, gambling addicts, people with Down Syndrome, refugees, homeless, S&M enthusiasts, people with facial differences, recent war veterans, ice users, suicide attempt survivors, children of same-sex parents and centenarians.

In tonight's first episode, blind people answer the questions Australians want to ask, no matter how naïve, cheeky or downright offensive the questions, our guests answer with personal insight and surprising honesty.

When asked, "What do you actually see? Blackness?" Lauren Henley from Melbourne who lost her vision as the result of a car accident says "*I've never been able to understand this but I see either bright pink or bright green.*" While Prof. Ron McCallum from Sydney, who has been blind since birth says, "*I don't know what black is because I haven't seen light, I don't really understand dark.*"

"How do you know you're not dressed like an idiot?" Matt Formston from Sydney explains "As a blind person you ask questions a lot about what I'm wearing today is that okay? and that is actually a really bad question because people don't give you honest feedback about yourself."

Asked "if you could see one thing in the world what would it be?" Bryony Balaton-Chrimes from Melbourne answers from the heart, *"I would want to see the faces of the people that I love most in the world."*

You Can't Ask That asks forthright and at times uncomfortable questions, which result in illuminating, moving, confronting and surprising answers.

NB: This is a special sneak peek episode airing on Thursday night before the new series continues in the regular Wednesday timeslot.

Stargazing For Beginners

Part reflection, part instruction, Stargazing for Beginners is a new 8-part animated series that encourages us to look up at the stars.

In a world where so little time is left for wonder, sound artist Camilla Hannan invites you to look up and beyond. Bringing these stories to life is animator Isobel Knowles who invites you to look up into the heavens and discover your fate in the stars. The space race, Star Wars, the Big Bang: the galaxies have always loomed large in science and our imagination. Stargazing has always been very DIY and in this series, we are given pointers on how to begin with the multitudes that fill our skies.

Episode 1: In the Beginning - Monday April 3 at 5.30pm on ABC ME & ABC iview

Come outside. Look up at the Milky Way, sweeping from the southwest horizon to the northeast. All you need for a good night's viewing is yourself, a good idea of where south and east are, and your hands.

Episode: 2 Orion - Tuesday April 4 at 5.30pm on ABC ME & ABC iview

Orion was a mighty hunter who vowed to kill all the earth's animals. Gaia, goddess of the earth asked Scorpio to kill Orion. Scorpio succeeded in killing Orion - he stung him with his stinger. To reward him, Gaia placed Scorpio in the night sky and you can see him chasing Orion across the sky in springtime. Looking northwest in the night sky, the three bright stars together are Orion's Belt, the two to the north are his shoulders and two to the south are his feet.

Episode 3: Lake in Brazil - Wednesday April 5 at 5.30pm on ABC ME & ABC iview

In a wooden canoe, in the middle of the night on a lake in Brazil in the heart of the Amazon forest, I can see nothing but stars, stars in the sky and reflected in the water. Accompanied by a frog chorus, we are reminded to take the time to go outside and gaze up at the night sky and bathe in its beauty.

Episode 4: Satellites - Thursday April 6 at 5.30pm on ABC ME & ABC iview

Ever seen a shooting star? What colour was it? If it was pink or multicolored, it may have been one of the millions of pieces of space junk that litter our orbit. Space is far from empty. Tens of thousands of satellites orbit the earth and reflect the sunlight, so sometimes they are mistaken for stars. The International Space station is the largest and brightest man made object orbiting the earth, sometimes shining brighter than Venus or Sirius. In this way, we humans have created our own stars.

Episode 5: Owl and the Pussycat - Friday April 7 at 5.30pm on ABC ME & ABC iview

Many stories look up to the night sky for inspiration. From the Owl and the Pussycat who looked up to the stars above to many myths and legends from around the world, inspiration is drawn from the skies. Set out on a voyage of discovery and wonder, traversing the oceans and skies with the aid of the constellations. Using the stars as reference points for navigation, until Magellan circumnavigated the earth, the earth was believed to be flat.

Episode 6: Aurora Australis - Saturday April 8 at 5.30pm on ABC ME & ABC iview

It snaps and crackles, it pops and claps. Aurora Borealis is the northern lights, Aurora Australis is the southern lights in the southern hemisphere. This stunning light show can be seen from some parts of Tasmania. This episode explains the science behind the Southern Lights and how what we see is similar to a glowing neon light.

Episode 7: Chaos

The universe is a chaotic place with constant construction and destruction with stars being constantly created and destroyed. Because space is so vast, earth can safely continue in its orbit safely without hitting other objects, but space junk litters the skies.

Episode 8: The Overview Effect

The overview effect describes the feeling astronauts experienced while looking back at the small dot of earth, our home in the magnitude of space. The fragility of earth inspired them to want to protect the planet from its own destruction and look after our world.

Transgender Kids: Who Knows Best?

Transgender Kids: Who Knows Best? explores the divisive debate over whether a child should be free to make permanent changes to their gender. Dr Kenneth Zucker once ran the largest public clinic in Toronto for treating children and adolescents with gender dysphoria: an often violent feeling that the body they were born in does not match their true gender. But then Zucker was fired and his clinic closed down amid comparisons to a religious zealot trying to 'cure' homosexuality. His supporters believe he is a victim of a virulent form of transgender politics that stifles freedom of speech. The programme features interviews with Zucker, his patients, the families, the clinicians and transgender activists.

Art Bites: The Wanderers

This 6 x 10 minute documentary series explores Art as Adventure. The Wanderers profiles six of Australia's most exciting street artists as they take their work on the road to unexpected and unusual parts of Australia - discovering the influence of a new environment on their individual artistic styles.

Episode: Guido Van Helten

Guido van Helten ventures to Manildra, in rural New South Wales, to use a working freight train as a canvas and paint a series of local portraits – creating a large scale art installation that will travel the countryside delivering street art to the surrounding areas.

Episode: Elliott Routledge

Abstract Artist, Elliott Routledge, journeys to a remote Aboriginal community in the Tiwi Islands. We follow Elliott as he paints a series of artworks, and learns about the artistic history, cultural practices, and techniques from local indigenous artists.

Episode: DabsMyla

Los Angeles based duo, DabsMyla, return to Australia to paint a mural in the heart of Surry Hills, Sydney. The 20-metre-tall mural serves an homage to one their earliest artistic inspirations, Brett Whiteley.

Episode: Georgia Hill

Georgia Hill brings her monochromatic lettering and pattern work to the isolated central highlands of Tasmania, where she explores the history and remoteness of the area before painting a 10 metre mural in the historic Hydro town of Tarraleah.

Episode: Amok Island

Amok Island journeys to the Heron Island Research facility on the Great Barrier Reef, learning about the ecology of the area and seeking inspiration via underwater photography, before painting a mural at a nearby abandoned marine park.

Episode: Rone

Melbourne Artist, Rone, travels to Port Vila, Vanuatu to update a cyclone-damaged wall painted several years earlier. He creates a series of portraits of local women, hoping to use his skills to form relationships with people from each neighborhood.

Todd Sampson's Life On the Line

Todd Sampson takes a leap of faith by bungee jumping with two interwoven phonebooks, and nothing but the friction between the pages arresting his fall.

With the help of astrophysicist Dr Alan Duffy, Todd explores the law of friction and reveals the latest science behind how this daring experiment actually works.

As he leaps off a bungee platform in Taupo on the north island of New Zealand, Todd's safety relies on two phonebooks intersecting his bungee cord. When he jumps, Todd will be starting from rest and accelerating by another 10 metres per second, every second he falls.

According to Alan's calculations, the phonebooks will have to sustain at least four times Todd's bodyweight. With the books carefully interleaved – one page on top of the other – Todd takes his leap of faith, trusting his life in the extraordinary holding power of friction

Creatives: Rosemary Valadon

Creatives captures a wide cross section of artists and their work – from drawings made deep down on the ocean floor to photographs of surfers riding the surface as it breaks; from still life paintings of formidable women to photographs of the bustling city; as well as the contribution of our most awarded editor has made to Australian cinema.

Rosemary Valadon: A Sensual World looks at the art and influences of an a multi award-winning Australian painter whose work has reinterpreted a distinctly Australian femininity and domestic aesthetic. With a career spanning 35 years, Valadon has won the Portia Geach Portrait Prize and the Blake Religious Art Prize, among others. From her portraits of Germaine Greer, Ruth Cracknell and Noni Hazlehurst as archetypal figures, to a fascination with female criminals from the 1940's that inspired a provocative series "Wicked Women" featuring paintings of author Tara Moss, Crown Prosecutor Margaret Cunneen and actor Essie Davis as femme fatales, Valadon has recently moved to still life painting, capturing stunning images of lush abundance and classic still life imagery. Set against the dramatic change of seasons in regional NSW, this film is a portrait of a great contemporary Australian artist and the Hill End community that has been a deep source of strength and creative inspiration for her.

Julia Zemiro's Home Delivery: Ronny Chieng

In the season final, Julia Zemiro meets comedian, actor and radio presenter Ronny Chieng. Now a resident of NYC, Ronny contributes to Comedy Central's The Daily Show. Born in Malaysia, raised in the US and Singapore, he spent some years in Australia studying and performing. In 2012 he was named one of the top ten Rising Comedians by The Age and Herald Sun and last year he was listed by Variety magazine as one of 10 Comics to Watch. He's currently in production of a new comedy series, TV show, Ronny Chieng: International Student.

In a very different Home Delivery, Ronny shows Julia through the apartment he grew up in and where his parents still live. He describes the years the family lived in the US and the difficulty in re-adjusting to life in a Singapore Primary School. They visit Fuchun Primary School which is abandoned and unoccupied and they talk about how competitive the Singaporean education system is.

They meet Ronny's physics and form teacher, Mr. Tan. Ronny's a little embarrassed listening to an 'interview' about himself but clearly enjoys meeting his old teacher.

In a Singapore Park, Julia asks Ronny about his years at Melbourne Uni and he recounts how his comedy career started there and talks about working on The Daily Show. He earned his law degree but didn't tell his parents about his stand-up aspirations until he was successful enough to be on TV.

Silent Witness

Emilia Fox, Richard Lintern and David Caves return in this award-winning crime drama which celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2016. Dr Nikki Alexander (Fox), Dr Thomas Chamberlain (Lintern) and Dr Jack Hodgson (Caves) form a dedicated team of forensic pathologists whose job it is to work out how and why the victim died.

This series sees Nikki investigate a murder that's a carbon copy of a case from her past, but who will believe her as she soon suspects that the killings are personal to her. Jack creates tension when he finds himself aligned with a police complaints investigator over the accidental shooting of a girl by armed police. And a seemingly random killing in the remote countryside leads Nikki and Jack into the dangerous underbelly of a criminal world.

In episode one, the apparent suicide of a DJ leads Nikki (Emelia Fox) to question her judgement on a strikingly similar case from her past. The similarities between the cases reveal that a copycat killer is out there - someone who is forensically aware and possibly medically trained.

As further comparisons appear between the murders and Nikki's past, she soon suspects that the killings are personal.

Meanwhile Tony, a family man recently released from prison for an attempted murder he supposedly didn't commit, struggles to come to terms with his new life. The links between Tony's incarceration and Nikki's past become apparent as she goes in search of an old rival who may hold the answers to the current murders.

The Coroner

A crime series set against a stunning coastal backdrop sees high-flying solicitor Jane Kennedy in the Devon town she left as a teenager, investigating sudden or unexplained deaths in her role as coroner.

In this episode, the remains of a new born baby wrapped in 1970s newspaper is found in a cottage condemned by coastal erosion. A nearby closed down children's home, Greyvale, leads Coroner Jane Kennedy (Claire Goose) and Davey Higgins (Matt Bardock) to interviews with the uncooperative former residents and staff and finally to three sisters; one of whom, Lisa Millar, is missing.

Her brother Lee Millar, another former resident of the home, who is visiting from America, knows more than he is admitting and his attempts to protect his sisters lead Jane to mistakenly suspect incest.
