BRITTANY SNOW

Sophie O'Neil

With a career that spans over two decades of creative endeavors, Brittany Snow is one of the most dedicated & recognizable actors in Hollywood. Her on-screen talents are evident across the spectrum, from starring roles in films such as Universal's smash hit franchise *Pitch Perfect*; 20th Century Fox's *John Tucker Must Die*; and New Line's *Hairspray*; to award-winning independent films like *Vicious Kind*, which premiered at Sundance; to the small screen in multiple hit series, including NBC's *American Dreams* and Ryan Murphy's *Nip/Tuck* for FX. Snow brings her talent behind the camera and below the line as a writer and director, taking her directorial short debut, *Milkshake*, on the festival circuit in 2019, with a premiere at the Palm Springs Short Film Festival.

In March 2023, Snow debuted her directorial feature film *Parachute* at the SXSW Film Festival in the Narrative Feature Competition and won the Thunderbird Rising Special Award. The drama was also written and produced by Snow, with an impressive cast including Courtney Eaton, Thomas Mann, Scott Mescudi, Gina Rodriguez, Dave Bautista, Joel McHale, among others. *Parachute* tells the story of two people who meet after being released from precarious situations on the exact same day; Ethan (Mann) was released from jail for throwing a bottle of wine off a balcony, while Riley (Eaton) was released from rehab for an eating disorder, love addiction, and suicide attempt. The film was released in theaters in early April 2024 at the same time it went to home streaming.

Snow continues to captivate audiences as she showcases her versatility in the lead role of the critically acclaimed Academy Award-nominated short film *Red, White, And Blue*. In this poignant film, she embodies resilience as Rachel, a single mother grappling with an unexpected pregnancy that threatens to crumble her already precarious situation.

Next up, she will star in the highly anticipated second season of the Netflix hit series *The Night Agent*, the most-watched series in the first half of 2023, alongside Hong Chau. Snow will also be seen in the Utopia original, *The Good Half*, opposite Nick Jonas from director Robert Schwartzman. The film debuted at The Tribeca Film Festival in 2023 and will be released later this year.

Snow also starred in the breakout A24 film 'X' alongside Mia Goth, Jenna Ortega, and Scott Mescudi, which premiered at the SXSW Film Festival with a US theatrical release

immediately following. The film is 94% fresh on Rotten Tomatoes and received attention from critics' groups nationwide.

Other recent credits include the Fox series *Almost Family* from Jason Katims; the indie feature *Hooking Up* opposite Sam Richardson, which she also produced; the Paul Feig-produced *Someone Great* opposite Gina Rodriguez for Netflix; *Bushwick* opposite Dave Bautista; *Hangman* opposite Al Pacino; *Harry's Law* with Kathy Bates; *Call Me Crazy* alongside Octavia Spencer; *The Late Bloomer* with JK Simmons; and *Dial a Prayer* opposite William H Macy.

A committed advocate for change, Brittany co-founded Love is Louder in September 2010 with The Jed Foundation and MTV to create more inclusive communities and support anyone feeling mistreated, misunderstood, or alone. Snow then founded *September Letters*, a mental health awareness and therapeutic writing experience, with the Mental Health Foundation. The *September Letters* book she wrote alongside her charity partner, Jaspre Guest, was published by Harper Collins in May 2023.

Snow's numerous honors for her advocacy work included a Special Recognition Award from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), the Creative Coalition Mental Health Humanitarian Award, the Inspire a Difference Award from *Glamour Magazine*, and the Ally Award from the Human Rights Campaign.

MALIN ÅKERMAN

Margo Banks

Named one of *Variety's* "10 Actors to Watch" in 2007, Swedish-Canadian actress and producer Malin Åkerman has been tearing up Hollywood since with her beauty and charisma, her sharp comedic timing, and her touching dramatic performances.

Åkerman's range in comedy and drama is exemplified by her diverse body of work in film and television. In 2007 she starred alongside Ben Stiller in *The Heartbreak Kid*, directed by the Farrelly brothers; followed by the 2008 romantic comedy, *27 Dresses*, directed by Anne Fletcher; and a year later she joined Sandra Bullock and Ryan Reynolds in Fletcher's *The Proposal*. In 2009, Åkerman was seen in the comedy *Couples Retreat*, opposite Vince Vaughn, Kristen Bell, Jason Bateman, and Jon Favreau; and co-starred in Zack Snyder's blockbuster *Watchmen*, which opened at number one with more than \$50 million at the box office. She was seen in theaters nationwide in the 2010 Sundance Audience-Award winner, *Happythankyoumoreplease*, opposite Kate Mara, Zoe Kazan, and Josh Radnor; and at the 2011 Tribeca Film Festival, Åkerman shared the big screen with Ryan Philippe and Taylor Kitsch in Steven Silver's *The Bang Bang Club*.

In 2012, Åkerman graced the big screen in *Wanderlust*, with Paul Rudd and Jennifer Aniston; sang alongside Tom Cruise in the musical adaptation of the Broadway hit *Rock of Ages*; and starred in Sebastian Gutierrez's nod to classic film noir, *Hotel Noir*.

Åkerman starred in the feature film *Final Girls* in 2015, opposite Taissa Farmiga and Nina Dobrev; and had a role opposite Blythe Danner in 2015's critically acclaimed film, *I'll See You in My Dreams*. She also appeared on the big screen in 2016 in Lionsgate's *Misconduct*, opposite Anthony Hopkins and Al Pacino; as well as the independent film, *The Ticket*, opposite Dan Stevens and directed by Ido Fluk, which made its feature debut at the 2016 Tribeca Film Festival.

In 2018, Åkerman starred as the villain in Warner Brother's *Rampage*, opposite Dwayne Johnson and Naomie Harris. The movie grossed more than \$426 million worldwide and is the all-time best reviewed film based on a video game. Åkerman can be seen in the 2019 Sundance Film Festival hit *To the Stars*, which tells the story of 1960s Oklahoma where a shy farmer's daughter forges an intimate relationship with a new girl.

Åkerman also starred in Netflix's 2020 hit *The Sleepover*, alongside Joe Manganiello. In Fall 2020, she also starred in and produced the comedy *Friendsgiving*, alongside Kat Dennings, Wanda Sykes, and Jane Seymour; in addition to starring in the indie action-comedy *Chick Fight*, alongside Alec Baldwin and Bella Thorne.

In 2022, Åkerman starred in the rom com *A Week in Paradise*, alongside her husband Jack Donnelly, Connie Nielsen, and Philip Winchester. In addition, she can be seen as the lead in the thriller *The Aviary*, which follows two women, Blair and Jillian, who flee into the New Mexican desert to escape the clutches of an insidious cult.

Åkerman also executive produced and starred in the 2022 feature film *Slayers*, which is a fresh, fun, and pulse-pounding take on the Vampire genre. Directed by K. Asher Levin, Åkerman stars alongside Lydia Hearst, Kara Hayward, and Jack Donnelly.

Most recently, Åkerman starred in *The Donor Party*, alongside Rob Corrdry and Jerry O'Connell. In this comedy, Åkerman's character realizes she doesn't need a husband to be a mother after a messy divorce and wasted years of online dating.

Åkerman is also no stranger to the small screen. Her breakthrough came in 2005 on the HBO series *The Comeback*, with Lisa Kudrow. She had a memorable recurring role on the third season of *Entourage*, as well ABC's hit comedy, *Suburgatory*. She was seen in a special episode of *How I Met Your Mother* and starred in the third season of Adult Swim's Emmy Award-winning medical-drama parody, *Children's Hospital*. From 2013-2014 she starred in the title character of ABC's comedy, *Trophy Wife*, opposite Bradley Whitford, Marcia Gay Harden, and Michaela Watkins.

In 2016, Malin starred in Showtime's television series *Billions* as the fierce Lara Axelrod, alongside Damian Lewis and Paul Giamatti, for four seasons. Most recently, she can be seen starring in AMC's anthology series entitled *Soulmates*, which premiered in October 2020 alongside Charlie Heaton. Åkerman can also be seen reprising her role in the second season Hulu's hit comedy *Dollface*, alongside Kat Dennings.

In 2024, Åkerman hosted the global music television phenomenon, *Eurovision Song Contest*, alongside fellow Swede, Petra Mede, from Malmö, Sweden.

Åkerman resides in Los Angeles with her husband Jack Donnelly and son Sebastian. In her spare time, she enjoys volunteering for organizations such as the Environmental Media Association, Children's Hospital Los Angeles, and Opportunity International.

DERMOT MULRONEY

Jed Banks

With a career that spans nearly four decades, actor and musician Dermot Mulroney has amassed an impressive résumé of dynamic performances across film and television, working with several of the industry's most revered directors. Each decade marked by a project so entrenched within pop culture and surrounded by critical acclaim, that

Mulroney is considered a beloved anchor of the zeitgeist of entertainment - from 1988's *Young Guns*, to 1997's *My Best Friend's Wedding*, to 2005's *The Family Stone*, and 2013's *August: Osage County*. The latter resulted in a 2014 Screen Actors Guild nomination for Outstanding Performance by a Cast in a Motion Picture.

Most recently, Mulroney can be seen in Sony Pictures' highly anticipated romantic comedy *Anyone but You*, opposite Sydney Sweeney and Glen Powell from director Will Gluck. The film follows Sydney and Glen's characters who despise one another yet can't seem to get away from the other while attending a destination wedding in Sydney, Australia. Mulroney stars as Sydney's affectionate and loving father.

He can also be seen in two independent films: the thriller *Breakwater* and the revenge thriller *Ruthless*. In *Breakwater*, Mulroney gives a powerhouse performance as prison inmate Ray Childress, who enlists a just-released fellow prisoner (Darren Mann) with finding his daughter. The drama, set in an out-of-season holiday resort in the Outer Banks, received the Audience Favorite Feature Film Award and garnered a Best Actor Award for Mulroney at the Boston Film Festival. In *Ruthless* Mulroney takes on a more violent and physical role as a high school wrestling coach who is left mourning the death of his daughter who was murdered under mysterious circumstances.

He stars opposite Samuel L. Jackson as President Ritson in the highly anticipated Marvel's *Secret Invasion*. The series Disney+ is set in the present-day MCU as Nick Fury learns of a clandestine invasion of Earth by a faction of shapeshifting Skrulls.

In June 2023, Mulroney was seen starring in Peacock's LeBron James biographical film *Shooting Stars*, as Keith Dambrot, James's coach at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School and a key figure to his path to superstardom. He was also seen in Showtime's thriller miniseries *Ghosts of Beirut*. The spy drama tells the story of an elusive Lebanese terrorist who evaded capture from the CIA and Mossad for two decades from the American, Israeli, and Lebanese perspectives.

In 2023, Mulroney was seen in Paramount Pictures' iconic horror franchise *Scream* as Detective Bailey. He starred in *Scream VI* alongside Melissa Barrera, Jasmin Savoy Brown, Mason Gooding, Jenna Ortega, and *Scream IV*'s Hayden Panettiere. The film continues with the four survivors of the Ghostface killings as they leave Woodsboro and start fresh in NYC. It broke box office records for the franchise.

In 2021, Mulroney was seen in Sony Pictures Entertainment's horror feature film *Umma* opposite Sandra Oh, from producer Sam Raimi and in Netflix's drama *Along for the Ride*.

His other work includes Focus Features' *Insidious 3* as the lead, which was nominated for a 2016 People's Choice Award for Favorite Thriller Movie; Open Road's Steve Job's biographical film *Jobs* and Liam Neeson's *The Grey*, directed by Joe Carnahan; Clint Eastwood's award-winning film *J. Edgar* for Warner Bros'; Warner Bros' *Must Love Dogs*; David Fincher's true-crime thriller *Zodiac* for Paramount Pictures; Universal Pictures' *The Wedding Date*; Alexander Payne's Oscar-nominated film *About Schmidt*; and Sony Pictures Classics' *Living In Oblivion*, and more.

Mulroney is just as prolific on the small screen, appearing in award-winning, audience favorites such as Amazon Prime's *Hanna* and *Homecoming*; HBO's *Righteous*

Gemstones; Arrested Development; ABC's Station 19; FOX's New Girl; and notably as Sean Pierce for Showtime's fan favorite award-winning drama Shameless.

Mulroney is also an expert cellist, having been classically trained since he was a child. From his first performance at 7-years-old to winning solo competitions as a teenager, Mulroney continued to hone his craft as a student at Northwestern University, performing in the school's symphony for all four years. He can be heard on several film scores from Academy Award-winning composer Michael Giacchino including *Mission: Impossible – Ghost Protocol, Star Trek: Beyond, Rogue One: A Star Wars Story, and Incredibles 2.*

In 1994, along with his brother Kieran Mulroney and James Fearnley, he co-founded the Los Angeles band The Low and Sweet Orchestra, which fastened a string-and-accordion section to the traditional format of drums, bass, guitar, and vocals. They released the acclaimed album *Goodbye to All That* on Interscope Records in 1996. A couple of years after, The Low and Sweet Orchestra split up and the Mulroneys and Fearnley formed Cranky George, recording an EP of original material augmented by mandolin, guitar, and ukulele. In 2016, Cranky George recorded an album called *Fat Lot of Good* with Brad Wood on bass and Sebastian Sheehan Visconti on drums. They played a series of live shows, which incorporated foot-operated percussion and a hatbox bass drum.

Some of Mulroney's performance highlights include playing with Alanis Morissette at the House of Blues, with Jon Batiste during an appearance on *The Late Show with Stephen Colbert*, and the 2nd stage appearance at Lollapalooza in 1996.

JAIME RAY NEWMAN

Callie Baskin

Jaime Ray Newman recently had a recurring role on the new Apple TV series created by Don Cheadle, *The Big Cigar*. She also had a recurring role on the critically acclaimed, Emmy-winning Hulu series *Dopesick*, opposite Michael Keaton, as well as on *The Time Traveler's Wife* for HBO. She recently guest starred in Season 2 of *Bel Air* on Peacock. In the past, Newman held prominent recurring roles in both *Deputy* on FOX and *Little Fires Everywhere* on Hulu, opposite Reese Witherspoon and Kerry Washington.

Her other TV work includes recurring on *Veronica Mars, The Magicians, The Imposters, Major Crimes, Satisfaction, CSI, Drop Dead Diva, and Nip/Tuck*. Jaime also starred in NBC's *Midnight Texas* and Netflix's Season One of Marvel's *The Punisher*. Her other credits include A&E's *Bates Motel*, and ABC's *Wicked City* and *Eastwick*.

Newman will next be seen in Anonymous Content's film *Override* and in the independent film *Exhibiting Forgiveness*, directed by Titus Kaphar, which premiered at Sundance to rave reviews. She recently starred in the independent feature film *Tatami*, directed by Guy Native and produced by both Newman and Native, which premiered at the 2023 Venice Film Festival to a terrific response. Her other film work includes appearing in *Catch Me If You Can, Rubberneck, the independent movie Red Robin, as well as the remake of the animated film Tarzan*. She can also be seen in the feature *Valley of The Gods*, opposite Josh Hartnett and John Malkovich.

Newman received an Academy Award for best short in 2018 for *Skin*. She will next be seen in the short film *Kinship*, directed by Daniel Ramirez and produced by Lawrence Bender and Kevin Brown. She is currently developing projects alongside her husband, Guy Native, for their production company, New Native Pictures.

EVAN JONIGKEIT***Graham O'Neil***

Evan Jonigkeit can most recently be seen Robert Siegel's Hulu limited series *Welcome to Chippendales*, opposite Kumail Nanjiani and Murray Bartlett. Previously he starred in Netflix's sci-fi series *Archive 81*, which peaked as the #1 title worldwide on the platform.

His recent projects include Dave Franco's Amazon film *Somebody I Used to Know*; Jen Silverman's production of *Witch* at the Geffen Playhouse, which won the 2019 Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award for Production; David Bruckner's thriller *The Night House*, co-starring alongside Rebecca Hall and Sarah Goldberg; Nikole Beckwith's *Together Together*, co-starring Ed Helms and Patti Harrison; and Season Two of the Plan B/Starz half-hour drama series *Sweetbitter*. He can also be seen starring alongside Elliot Page in the Sian Heder's film *Tallulah*, currently on Netflix; as well as three seasons of Joe Swanberg's anthology series, *Easy*, opposite Aya Cash, Dave Franco and Zazie Beetz; and two seasons of Brad Peyton's period drama, *Frontier*.

Other films include *Whiskey Tango Foxtrot*, opposite Tina Fey; *Empty Man*, opposite James Badge Dale; *Brave New Jersey*, with Tony Hale; *Bone Tomahawk*, with Kurt Russell and Patrick Wilson; and *X-Men Days of Future Past* as Toad.

He starred opposite Mary-Louise Parker on Broadway in *The Snow Geese* for director Dan Sullivan at Manhattan Theatre Club; and opposite Zosia Mamet in the MCC Off-Broadway play *Really Really*, directed by David Cromer. His theater accolades include an Outer Critics Award for his Broadway debut in *High*, opposite Kathleen Turner.

As a producer, Jonigkeit was nominated for a Creative Arts Emmy for his telethon, *Stand for Rights: A Benefit for The ACLU With Tom Hanks*. He was also a producer on the 2017 ESPY AWARDS, in addition to several TV and film projects.

GEORGE FERRIER***Brad Thompson***

George Ferrier first garnered attention with a breakout performance opposite the legendary Charlotte Rampling in Matthew Saville's feature film *Juniper*. He has since appeared in multi-season recurring roles on the Peacock series *One of Us is Lying* and the Netflix series *Sweet Tooth*.

KATIE LOWES***Jill Thompson***

Katie Lowes is a force on both stage and screen, best known for starring as Quinn Perkins for 7 seasons on ABC's hit series *Scandal*, opposite a stellar cast including Kerry Washington and Tony Goldwyn, created by Shonda Rhimes.

In Spring 2022, Lowes returned to network television in CBS' half-hour comedy *How We Roll*. Lowes starred opposite comedian Pete Holmes in the series based on professional bowler Tom Smallwood's life. Lowes plays the role of Jen, Tom's (Holmes) warm and caring wife and son Graham's loving mother. In Winter 2022, Lowes starred in Shonda Rhimes's Netflix series *Inventing Anna*, opposite Anna Chlumsky, Julia Garner, and Laverne Cox, which was the number one streaming show within the first two weeks of release, according to Nielsen Ratings. The series is based on true events in which a

journalist investigates the case of Anna Delvey, the Instagram-legendary heiress who stole the hearts – and money – of New York’s social elite.

Lowes hosted the popular weekly parenting podcast titled “Katie’s Crib,” which was produced by Shondaland in partnership with iHeartRadio. “Katie’s Crib” ran for 6 seasons, covering the unexpected joys, pains, foibles, and hilarity of new motherhood. Each episode highlights a specific parenting issue from a variety of different points of view. Lowes conducted frank, intimate conversations with fellow moms (such as A-List actresses Kristen Bell, America Ferrera, Gabrielle Union and many more) about the ups and downs of being a new parent.

In Summer 2021, Lowes lent her voice to Netflix’s animated film *Vivo*. The film also featured voices from Lin-Manuel Miranda, Zoe Saldana, Gloria Estefan, Nicole Byer; with Miranda writing several songs for the movie.

In Fall 2018, Lowes made her Broadway debut, starring in the Tony Nominated Musical *Waitress* with Katharine McPhee. Lowes played the role of Dawn opposite her real-life husband, actor Adam Shapiro.

Lowes is no stranger to the big or small screen. Over the years she appeared in big budget films such as Disney’s *Ralph Breaks the Internet*; Dreamworks’ *Transformers 2*; Bad Robot’s *Super 8*, directed by JJ Abrams; and was the voice of Abigail in the 2015 Academy Award-winning Animated Feature Film *Big Hero 6*. In addition, she voiced an animated character in the 2015 Academy Award-winning Animated Short Film *Feast*, and the Oscar-nominated Disney film *Wreck It Ralph*. Lowes was the inspiration behind the motion and movement work for Idina Menzel’s character Elsa in the movie *Frozen*.

Additionally, she has appeared in several independent films including *Dinner for Four*, *The Job*, *Callers*, *Bear*, and *Café*. She has been a guest star on hit series such as *The Closer*; *Grey’s Anatomy*; *Private Practice*; *Leverage*; *Castle*; *The Sopranos*; *N.C.I.S.*; and was a series regular on the CW show *Easy Money*, created by producers of *The Sopranos*. Lowes regularly guest co-hosts *Live with Kelly and Ryan* with Ryan Seacrest.

Born in Queens, Lowes is a graduate of NYU Tisch School of the Arts and the co-artistic director of IAMA Theatre Company, named one of the top 20 regional theatres in the country, and in its 17th season in LA, where she lives with her husband and two children.

CHRISSY METZ

Starr Jackson

Emmy and two-time Golden Globe nominee Chrissy Metz is best known for her breakout role as Kate Pearson in the award-winning NBC series, *This is Us*, winner of the 2018 and 2019 SAG Award for Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble in a Drama Series and People’s Choice Award for Favorite New TV Drama.

Metz is starring in the upcoming British feel-good comedy, *Bank of Dave: The Sequel*, based on a true story about victims of payday lenders. Metz’s other credits include *American Horror Story*, *My Name is Earl*, *Entourage*, *The Last OG*, and the Netflix film *Sierra Burgess is a Loser*. She also starred in the feature films *Stay Awake* and *Breakthrough*, in which she also performed the Oscar-nominated title song, “I’m Standing with You,” written by Diane Warren.

Metz's memoir, *This is Me*, debuted at #1 on the NY Times Bestseller list, as did her children's book, *When I Talk to God, I Talk About You*, which is paired with her album, *Prayed for This Day*.

People magazine named her to the "Ones to Watch" and "50 Most Beautiful" lists.

Glenn was raised in a large military family and has lived domestically and abroad, which attributes to her diverse interests.
