Joanna Lumley's Japan

Joanna travels to the island of Shikoku to undertake a pilgrimage, visiting a selection of temples to gain a better understanding of Japanese Buddhism. She then takes a bullet train to the fourth of Japan's main islands; Kyushu, where she finds the Henn Na Hotel, the world's first robot hotel.

Joanna travels south to Nagasaki – the site of the second atomic bomb to be dropped on Japan in 1945. She visits Shiroyama Elementary school which was the school closest to the bomb's hyper centre, and one of the only buildings to survive. Joanna meets Matsuyoshi Ikeda – a student of the school, the day the bomb dropped. He shares his miraculous story of survival.

Joanna travels south to Kagoshima and home to one of Japan's most active volcanoes, Sakurajima. She witnesses a volcano drill at the local elementary school and takes to the skies in a plane, to get as close as possible to the crater.

Joanna's final destination is the islands of Okinawa where one of the bloodiest battles of WW2 was fought between Japanese and American troops. This is where the Japanese Navy made the ultimate sacrifice - committing seppuku (suicide, Samurai style) instead of being captured by the American forces.

For her final destination Joanna travels to Kohama, an island whose population is famed for the longevity of its residents. She meets members of KBG84, a group of charming elderly ladies who produced a pop video that topped the Japanese charts.

Heather Ewart arrives by ferry on Thursday Island to be greeted by local woman Elsie Seriat, who says 'TI' should be on everyone's 'bucket list'.

Thursday Islanders live by the sea and their culture and identity revolve around it.

It's also entrenched Rugby League territory, and Heather is visiting during TI's biggest celebration of the year – the Island of Origin Rugby League Carnival.

Elise shows Heather how sport, music and new industries are helping Thursday Island remain a fascinating and viable part of Australia. Heart disease and diabetes are big problems here, so Elsie has set up the TI Deadly Runners group, which even Elsie's mum has joined.

Elsie introduces Heather to Hip Hop artist Patrick Mau who is also part of this new generation of Torres Strait Islanders. Patrick performs around the world, but the internet allows him to base himself on TI and raise his young family by the sea.

Heather meets Patrick's grandfather, famous musician Seaman Dan, or 'Uncle' Seaman as he's known to everyone on TI. Uncle Seaman is proud of his people and tells his grandchildren, they're Torres Strait Islander, "stand up straight, look people in the eye and keep smiling, that's what I do".

Heather learns about the struggles of the local Kaurareg Aboriginal people, and discovers the biggest issue currently facing the island is a severe housing shortage.

But during her time on TI, Heather learns that this is a place bursting with creativity, with determined and resilient locals, who are coming up with new ways to meet challenges head on.

Rick Stein: From Venice To Istanbul

Capturing the flavour of an ancient empire, chef Rick Stein embarks on a memorable odyssey through Italy, Croatia, Albania, Greece and Turkey during this new seven-part series.

Exploring the culinary legacy of the legendary Byzantine Empire, Rick uncovers its little-known history and cuisine, and relishes the food that many people associate with holidays in the eastern Mediterranean and the Adriatic – healthy, light, tasty dishes that go so well with sunshine, remote islands, chilled wine and clear, aquamarine seas.
