Season 3 begins with a double episode

The multi-award-winning ABC and SundanceTV (USA) comedy series **Rosehaven** is back for a third season. The eight episodes feature new guest stars and fresh stories about the quirky and loveable town of Rosehaven.

Written by and starring two of Australia's favourite comedians Luke McGregor and Celia Pacquola, *Rosehaven* follows the story of two friends and unlikely real estate agents, Daniel (expat Tasmanian McGregor) and Emma (Pacquola). Series three finds the best friends and workmates facing big changes in their personal lives and a real estate opportunity that threatens to divide the whole town.

Series 3 sees Daniel and Emma establishing a full life in Rosehaven. Daniel is happily living

with his girlfriend Grace (Katie Robertson), while Emma is still housemates with Barbara (Kris McQuade).... that is, until she sells the family home without telling anyone.

In the first episode, when the professionalism of McCallum Real Estate is brought into question, Daniel sets out to fix their reputation while Emma befriends a pig.

Episode two sees Emma and Daniel trying to prevent a tenant from moving house, after he finds out that the previous owner actually died in the house and the neighbours are eager to pay their respects. Emma and Daniel come up with a unique fix for the awkward situation.

The Great Australian Bee Challenge (Part One)

We Australians share our country with one of the world's most beautiful, fragile and industrious creatures - bees. They are an incredibly important part of the natural environment - pollinating around a third of the food we eat. While in many parts of the world bees are under threat, Australia remains a safe haven for them – for now.

In the first of two programs, host Paul West introduces four teams of novice bee keepers to these hardworking insects, and with the help of entomologist Dr Tanya Latty and expert bee keeper Doug Purdie, they learn to build thriving hives – and that means delving into the very latest science behind bee communication, brains, and behaviour.

With two teams in the city and two in the country, our amateur beekeepers encounter all sorts of challenges on their journeys. In the city, our rooftop hive is showing signs of stress; while in the country a cold, dry Spring - with no sign of nectar for the bees to feed upon - has set our rural participants back. But it's the family in metropolitan Erskineville that throw a massive spanner in the works by moving houses. They take their hive with them – but will the bees follow?

Short synopsis

In the first of two programs, host Paul West challenges four families to successfully keep a honeybee hive, bringing these everyday Australians up close to the very latest science about bee brains, communication and behaviour.

Gardening Australia

In 2019 ABC's perennial gardening program, *Gardening Australia* is turning 30. After a few weeks of well-earned rest in a shady hammock, *Gardening Australia* is back for our 30th year of great gardening ideas, spectacular plants and the nation's most passionate gardeners. Here's what we've got lined up for our first week:

Jane Edmanson is on Lord Howe Island, where the red volcanic soil has sustained a healthy harvest of fruit and vegetables for generations of islanders.

Costa Georgiadis visits a school garden where the whole community gets on board with composting their food scraps – and the chickens and worms think it's great!



Millie Ross meets a man who specialises in breeding the most beautiful sunflowers and discovers there's more to these plants than just a pretty facet. Tino Carnevale has some smart and simple solutions for gardeners who are trying to resist gravity when growing on a slope.

Josh Byrne adds to the edible plants growing on and around his deck by planting out a range of warm-climate herbs and greens. Sophie Thomson explores an urban waterway that has been rejuvenated to form the basis of a huge wetland and wildlife project in central Adelaide. Jerry Coleby-Williams shows how a bit of know-how — and a lot of patience — can help you propagate even the toughest of garden plants.



Back Roads - The Coorong

This week Heather Ewart visits The Coorong, an area that spans 130 kilometres of South Australian coastline but has a population that hovers around just 50 people. It's a stunning mosaic of wild ocean beaches, lagoons and wetlands, but in many ways it's become the 'forgotten end' of the mighty Murray River.

However, some Australians will remember it as the home of Colin Thiele's beloved characters from the classic book and 1976 film, *Storm Boy.* Now local residents have had the chance to become involved in the story again, with a new film version of the story being released in January 2019.

Pelicans still abound in the internationally-recognised breeding grounds of The Coorong, attracting many other birds as well. Not all of them are waterbirds – even emus are also found running through the dunes. That might be why it's attracted scientists and bird fanciers from near and far. One of those who's stayed near, birdwatcher and photographer Pam Gillen, has captured some of the most intimate images of the pelican chicks as well as many rare shorebirds. The waterways also abound with Coorong mullet, Coorong Cockles, seals and sailing boats.

On the land, the old stone church of the Raukkan community is celebrated on the \$50 note. It's also the home of popular stand-up comedian Kevin Kropinyeri, whose family has lived on the water for generations. His son, Kevin Jnr, has stayed closer to home, helping run the community's indigenous fruit and flower industry.

Opposite Raukkan is an area called The Narrows, which has Australia's only inland lighthouse. As a special treat, the locals light it up to show Heather, for only the second time since 1931.

Across the other side of Lake Albert is the tiny town of Meningie, where Pam the bird-watcher lives. Its claim to fame remains related to birds – in a way. It's where the legend of the tiny, bearded, bejewelled, barely-dressed, ostrich-riding bushranger, the 'Birdman of the Coorong' originated. Only in The Coorong!

From Executive Producer Michael Schur (Brooklyn Nine-Nine, Parks and Recreation, Master of None) comes a smart, unique new comedy about what makes a good person. The show follows Eleanor Shellstrop (Kristen Bell, House of Lies, Veronica Mars), an ordinary woman who enters the afterlife and, thanks to some kind of error, is sent to the Good Place instead of the Bad Place, which is definitely where she belongs. While hiding in plain sight from Michael (Ted Danson, CSI, Cheers), the wise architect of the Good Place (who doesn't know he's made a mistake), she's determined to shed her old way of living and discover the awesome (or, at least, the pretty good) person within.

Death In Paradise

DI Jack Mooney (Ardal O'hanlon) is settling into the sun-soaked idyll of Saint Marie and beginning to make the beach shack his home. But when his daughter Siobhan (Grace Stone) decides to leave for university, he finds himself living alone for the first time. Luckily, he has his team to support him as he faces some fiendishly taxing cases.

Jack's laconic style belies a sharp mind and relentless determination. He's a brilliant detective, but he'll need all his instinctive genius to solve the mysterious murders ahead: a champion poker player apparently poisoned at the table in front of an astonished audience: a novelist murdered in a plot more surprising than anything he's ever written: and a spiritual leader strangled at a time when all the suspects were each other's alibis. Jack needs to solve these seemingly impossible mysteries if he's to impress Commissioner Selwyn (Don Warrington) and make his mark on the island.

Her only saving grace is the unwavering support of her fellow singles Gemma (Katy Wix) and Roy (Mathew Horne), and the gang resolves to stay away from men forever, forming the Carsely single ladies group.

Desperately in need of some pampering and a new look, Agatha turns to the capable hands of Evesham's hottest new hairdresser, the alluring Jonny Shawpart (James Lance).
