Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo

The 2018 Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo features talent from the four corners of the globe performing on the magnificent Esplanade of Edinburgh Castle.

True to this year's Tattoo theme, The Sky Is The Limit, the international cast reaches the heights of entertainment in these highlights from the event, narrated by Bill Paterson.

The Combined Bands of The Royal Cavalry of The Sultanate of Oman bring a spectacular mounted display to Edinburgh. Silent precision drill and weapon skills from the United States Air Force Honor Guard Drill Team and, marking the centenary of the foundation of independent Czechoslovakia, the Central Band of the Czech Armed Forces make their Edinburgh debut.

The RAF College Band take centre stage as this year's 'home service' at the Tattoo. They are marking another centenary - that of the Royal Air Force. They are joined by The Royal Marines Band Plymouth and The Band of the Royal Regiment of Scotland for a fine display of British Military Music.

From North America, the Middlesex County Volunteers Fifes & Drums echo the music from the American War for Independence, whilst Central American tempo is brought by Banda Monumental De Mexico, showing the colours and spirits of Mexico.

The much-loved Shetland Fiddlers, Hjaltibinhoga, bring the sights and sounds of their island home with music echoing the sounds of the seabirds of Shetland. The Tattoo Dance Company provides their usual high standard of massed dancing with a tribute to The Royal Air Force whilst, from Basel, the Top Secret Drum Corps bring another exciting performance of virtuoso drumming, filled with precision, humour and thrilling tempo.

Wonderful music, heritage and spectacle are all packed into this highlights programme, with the sight and sound of Massed Pipes and Drums setting the scene and lone piper on the battlements of Edinburgh Castle rounding off a unique annual event.

Grand Designs Australia

With the long term plan to opt out for a simpler lifestyle, city slickers Glen and Kate Morris were delighted when they found 19 windswept acres near the seaside town of Inverloch on Victoria's south coast.

Sure, they wanted a more humble life but the journey in creating their new house would be the antithesis of that...because their plan was for something completely untested – a design based on a barchan sand dune...an arc shaped sand ridge.

The idea for the shape came first – conceived not from the floor up, but from the form down and that meant working out a floor plan to fit the crescent shape. Inside, 7 free standing rammed earth walls separate the spaces as well as help support a 'ring-beam' of super strong laminated timber, one of many invented systems in this house, that encircles the entire perimeter and props up a grand vaulted ceiling.

This is an adventurous and challenging undertaking but Glen and Kate's plan is to resolve any tricky geometry early on with a super scaled model....as well as put an end to the one big sticking point - the height of the cathedral like ceiling. It's the first of many compromises they face in building what is quickly dubbed the 'UFO' house.

Experiments by their mere nature are often open ended and costly and this one is no exception. Faced with escalating costs and slow progress Glen takes an early retirement and moves to the site in an effort to get things moving.

But nothing in this project is straightforward from lifting 700 kilo sheets of double glazing and fitting sheets of pure zinc roofing, to creating a network of intricate ceiling timber batons that look more like the carcass of a whale!

Will Glen and Kate get through this complex and difficult construction and end up with their original concept or will they be forced to trim and modify because curves simply cost too much?
