SHORT SYNOPSIS

Together, the trio aim to clinch the athletics carnival title from the "Wolf Pack" — the notorious grade five bullies. As Percy Boy trains, he uncovers his unique gift of seeing Lost Souls, a gift inherited from his grandfather. But as the big day approaches, a crisis looms over Herbertson and threatens Percy Boy's family and the town. ABOUT THE PRODUCTION DEVELOPMENT

When writer Boyd Quakawoot first unveiled the vibrant world of Percy Boy Collins — a ten-year-old Aboriginal boy whose quick wit and boundless resilience leap off the page — to producer Meg O'Connell in 2021, the story of Windcatcher captivated the team at Unless Pictures from the get-go. It promised a journey filled with laughter, heartwarming moments of family and friendship, and the universal theme of conquering fear. After a year of nurturing and refining the script, the project caught the eye of Stan and the Australian Children's Television Foundation (ACTF). When Tanith Glynn-Maloney signed on to direct, and Every Cloud Productions came on board as producing partner, Windcatcher swiftly moved into pre-production and is set to enchant audiences from March 2024. Get ready to be swept off your feet by the magic of Windcatcher — a story that promises not just to entertain but to inspire a deep, lasting love for its spirited hero and his unforgettable journey.

PRE-PRE PRODUCTION

Set against the nostalgic backdrop of Herbertson, a charming slice of 1998 Victoria untouched by the digital era's reach, Quakawoot crafts a tale that's a vivid postcard from a time when childhood was unencumbered by screens, and imaginations ran as free as the wind. Director Tanith Glynn-Maloney, in her debut feature, captures this essence with a warmth that feels like returning home, painting Herbertson with strokes of love, laughter, and the authentic spirit of small-town Australia. In order to achieve this, the team built early location scouting recces into their pre-pre production

process. Months before we went into production Tanith, Boyd, the producer, a location scout, and our production designer, Jo Ford, spent a week together in Melbourne and surrounds finding the perfect locations to shoot in and beginning to develop the world of the story together. In Windcatcher, the past comes alive in the most enchanting ways, creating a setting that's not just a place, but a character itself — familiar to those who've known the beauty of regional Victoria and inviting to all with its universal charm. The film dives deep into the heart of its characters, exploring the intricate dance between Percy, his eclectic family, and the schoolyard adversaries led by the "Wolf Pack." Here, Ford and Glynn-Maloney peel back layers to reveal the complexities and pressures on each of our characters, offering a narrative rich in empathy and understanding.

PRE PRODUCTION

At its heart, Windcatcher is a celebration of the bonds that tie us — to our family, our friends, and our heritage. Percy's story is a vibrant tapestry of connections, from his cherished moments with his grandfather to the friendships that blossom in adversity, uniting to outwit the bullies. These relationships, rich in warmth and humour, are the true soul of the film, demonstrating the power of unity and the magic of diverse friendships that defy expectations. We tried to bring as much of that spirit into the production process as possible. We conducted leadership training for our HODs; cultural training for the entire crew; we had all production staff in the one space which allowed for a creative environment to develop; and we brought HODs and crew on earlier wherever possible so that they had as much time to prep and get to know the world as we could offer them.





The film doesn't shy away from life's bigger themes — fear, loss, belonging — but tackles them with a gentle hand, guiding audiences through Percy's journey with a spirit of adventure and a heart full of hope. Casting is a triumph, bringing together a constellation of talent that lights up the screen, from Jessica Mauboy's return to acting to newcomer Lennox Monaghan's spirited portrayal of Percy, capturing the essence of a boy who dares to dream big. The whole cast became very close on set, and took part in cultural activities run by our cultural consultant, like a smoking ceremony. This, combined with Mauboy's incredibly open heart, meant you would often find the cast (and their siblings!) conducting impromptu sing-a-longs in the green room during their lunch.

The film's epic fire sequences were primarily shot at the Nant Studio LED Volume in Melbourne. This meant the film's ambition for creating immersive fire storm visuals could be achieved safely and eliminated the limitations of physical locations.

One of the main advantages of using the LED Volume was its ability to create highly realistic and interactive virtual fire storm environments. The LED screens surrounding the stage put our actors and physical environment objects directly in the centre of virtual bushfire elements. Shooting this way created a more immersive and believable experience for the actors to respond to.

The LED Volume's interactive nature also enabled real-time visualisation. Director Tanith Glynn- Maloney and our cinematographer Meg White could see the virtual environment in real-time on set, making it easier to adjust camera angles, lighting, and other elements to perfectly match the desired VFX shots.

Directed and shot with an eye for childhood wonder and a heart attuned to the stories that shape us, Glynn-Maloney and cinematographer Meg White drew inspiration from a rich tapestry of cinema references — from the thrill of sportsmanship and adventure (found in *Mighty Ducks* and *Remember the Titans*) to the depth of emotion and personal growth (found in *My Girl* and *Stand by Me*). *Windcatcher* weaves these influences into a story that's both a reflection of our own experiences and an invitation to embark on a journey filled with laughter, tears, and triumph.

POST PRODUCTION

Post-production had its surprises and challenges. We locked the film only to reopen it for one final week of editing; we created and shot a 30 second mock TVC with Brodie Grundy to open the film (at the eleventh hour); our VFX team worked on over 180 shots; Sam Pankurst composed 50 cues, 10 musicians, and dozens of instruments (a string quartet, a felt piano, melodicas, Wurlitzer, and a wall of synthesisers), including writing the music for the Kung Fu movie music you see in the film and the Hollywood fanfare at the sleepover!

Windcatcher is more than just a film; it's a vibrant celebration of life's journey, capturing the essence of youth, the challenges of growing up, and the timeless quest for courage and connection. It's a reminder of the joyous run through life's winds, the beauty of seeing the world with wonder, and the warmth of coming home to hearts that understand us without words. This film isn't just a story to be watched; it's an experience to be felt, a journey to be shared, and a heartwarming adventure that promises to leave audiences everywhere inspired, uplifted, and utterly enchanted.

CHARACTERS

PERCY BOY COLLINS

Percy Boy, a ten-year-old Aboriginal boy, might stand small in stature, but he's unmatched in speed—a fact he proudly shares with anyone who'll listen. Determined to earn his new running shoes, he's set his sights on winning school races and earning money from his early morning job. Percy skillfully avoids the "Wolf Pack" bullies until he forms an alliance with Keithy and Daisy, inadvertently making himself and his friends their new target. Guided by his Grandad, Percy not only faces his bullies but also encounters the Lost Souls, teaching him to overcome his fears, embrace humility, and realise the value of helping others.

KEITHY COBB

Keithy Cobb, a ten-year-old newcomer to the school, is the more reserved member of the trio, grappling with low confidence and self-esteem from his experience at his last school. In his quest for friendship, Keithy finds camaraderie with Percy Boy and Daisy, especially when they face the challenge of the "Wolf Pack." Through this alliance, Keithy discovers his voice, learning to stand up for himself and his friends.

DAISY HAWKINS

Daisy Hawkins, an eight-year-old sports enthusiast, is not just any third grader; she's a dynamo on the field and off. Her love for all things athletic makes her a formidable force, and her spirited nature draws Percy Boy and Keithy into her orbit just when they need it most—during a confrontation with the "Wolf Pack." Quick to stand beside her new friends, Daisy not only offers her companionship but also steps up as their coach, determined to sharpen their skills and strategize their victory against the school bullies. With Daisy's guidance, the trio learns the value of teamwork, perseverance, and the strength that comes from facing challenges together.



AUNTY CRESSIDA

Aunty Cressida, a resolute Aboriginal woman in her thirties, stands as Percy Boy's guardian. With a nononsense attitude, she shoulders the responsibility of caring for the family, embodying the role of both guardian and caretaker with unwavering dedication. Beyond her family duties, Aunty Cressida actively contributes to the community as a member of the State Emergency Service (SES) in Herbertson, their small town. She plays a crucial role in combating the fires that edge dangerously close to their home, demonstrating her commitment to protecting both her family and the town's safety.

CHARACTERS

POP

Percy's grandfather, affectionately known as 'Pop,' is a wise Indigenous man in his sixties. A man of few words, his wisdom runs deep, offering Percy Boy invaluable advice on handling school life, bullies, and fears. He is dedicated to imparting as much knowledge and guidance as possible to Percy at this tender age. More than just a family elder, Pop serves as Percy Boy's spiritual mentor, guiding him in the discovery of the Lost Souls, just as he once encountered them. Through Pop's teachings, Percy gains the courage and insight needed to assist these spirits, embodying the wisdom and strength passed down from his grandfather.



AUNTY PRUE

Aunty Prue, a pivotal figure in Percy Boy's family, is an Aboriginal woman in her sixties who once thrived as an artist, her beautiful paintings still adorning the walls of the Collins' household. In the face of dementia, she finds solace and companionship in her beloved furry toy cockatoo, Crackles. This cherished companion often leads her on wanderings around town, as she searches for Crackles whenever they are parted. Her quests for her cockatoo sometimes place Aunty Prue in precarious situations, prompting Percy Boy, Keithy, and Daisy to embark on heartfelt missions to find and ensure her safety. Aunty Prue's adventures underscore the deep bond within the family, as they navigate the challenges of her condition with love and dedication.

THE WOLF PACK

The Wolf Pack, a group of school bullies led by Ben Duncan, stands as the primary antagonists in the story. Ben, shaped by his father's own bullying tendencies, mirrors these behaviours, allowing his insecurities to manifest in acts of violence and intimidation. This group's dynamics, with Ben at the helm, highlight the cyclical nature of bullying, illustrating how personal struggles and external influences can lead to harmful actions towards others.



ABOUT THE CAST

LENNOX MONAGHAN as PERCY BOY COLLINS

Lennox is an extremely talented, all-rounder who is proud of his Bundjalung culture, which he is eager to share with the world. He recently completed filming the lead role of Percy Boy Collins in the Stan original feature film *Windcatcher*, alongside Jessica Mauboy, Pia Miranda and Kelton Pell.

Also a talented dancer and player of the Yidaki (Didgeridoo), Lennox regularly performs traditional Bundjalung dances and songs in language with Garimaa Nghari Dance Group at events throughout the Clarence Valley and beyond. He was personally selected to be a 'Specialist Performer' at the NSW Schools Spectacular in 2023 where he played his Yidaki (Digeridoo) and danced.

Lennox has also performed at countless opening ceremonies, NAIDOC events, Closing the Gap days, festivals including Byron Bay Bluesfest (Boomerang Festival), Kinship Festival and as a support act for Jessica Maubouy at Groove on the Grass. This year his dance group has been invited to perform at the Sydney Opera House in the DanceRites competition. He has also worked with the ABC Listen App team and features in some of their 'Little Yarns' podcasts.

A highly skilled sportsperson, Lennox has competed at representative cross country, athletics, swimming and is a member of numerous PSSA sporting teams representing his school and culture proudly.



JESSICA MAUBOY as AUNTY CRESSIDA Multiple ARIA-Award winning, R&B-pop artist, so

Multiple ARIA-Award winning, R&B-pop artist, songwriter and actress Jessica Mauboy is one of the country's most celebrated and loved entertainers.

Jess has an impressive body of work including 6 Top 10 Albums and 16 Top 20 Singles, over 200 million streams globally, 2 x ARIA Awards, 21 Platinum and 9 Gold accreditations, is the first indigenous Australian artist to debut at No. 1 on the ARIA Album Chart, multi-award winner including AACTA Award, APRA Award, Australian of the Year Award, MTV Europe Music Award, MTV Australia Music Award, not to mention her many TV roles including starring in *The Sapphires, Bran Nue Dae* and *The Voice* Australia Coach.

Jess' fifth studio album Yours Forever was released on February 9 and she commences her national tour in March.






KELTON PELL as POP

On the big screen, Kelton has appeared in Mad Bastards, Aunty Maggie And The Womba Wagkun, The Last Ride, Bran Nue Dae, Blackfellas, Australian Rules, Confessions Of A Headhunter, Cold Turkey, Where Two Rivers Meet, September, One Night The Moon and Stone Brothers. Recent Features Include Looking For Grace, Red Dog: True Blue, Three Summers and most recently, the Thriller, The Crossing and Drama Buckley's Chance.

Appearing in numerous television series, his credits include Mystery Road S3, Maverix, Firebite, The Heights, Pine Gap, Cloudstreet, The Moodys, Redfern Now, The Gods Of Wheat Street and The Circuit.

He has enjoyed an illustrious theatre career over thirty years with career highlights including SUMMER OF THE SEVENTEENTH DOLL and ENDGAME (Black Swan Theatre Company), BLOODLAND AND SECRET RIVER (Sydney Theatre Company) and THE SEASON (Performing Lines).

He will be returning to the MTC stage in 2024 to lead 37 directed by Isaac Drandic.

As a professionally trained dancer, Ngali has learned tap, ballet, hip hop, classical, modern contemporary and Capoeira. He was selected for the NSW Public Schools Aboriginal Dance Company and invited to participate in a one-week training camp with Bangarra Dance company. Under dance teacher Doug Gordon - Ngemba and Yuwalayaay Custodian, he has trained in Aboriginal/Indigenous dance since 2017.

Tanith's credits as producer include critically acclaimed and award-winning documentary, *She Who Must Be Loved*, AACTA Award-winning online series, *Robbie Hood* and as a director AACTA Award-winning short film *Finding Jedda*.

She has two projects due out in 2024 for Stan, her feature film directorial debut *Windcatcher* produced by Unless Pictures and Every Cloud Productions, and, *Thou Shalt Not Steal* - credited as Creator, Writer and Executive Producer as a co-pro with Ludo Studio.

Boyd Quakawoot is a writer of Australian South Sea Islander and Indigenous descent from Mackay in North Queensland, Yiwu Country. In 2019-2020 he was a writer on Season 4 of the ABC sketch comedy show *Black Comedy*. He was also a writer on Season 1 of the murder mystery series, *Black Snow* in 2023. He is also a writer on the murder mystery series, *Troppo* season two.

He was shortlisted for the 2020 Monte Miller Award -Short Form, for his short film screenplay, *Dawg and the Stonefish*. He has also been shortlisted twice for the David Unaipon Award at the Queensland Literary Awards and twice highly commended for the Black & Write Fellowship with the Queensland State Library.

Windcatcher is the first feature he has written.

Director of Photography - MEG WHITE

Meg White is a cinematographer who works in film, television, commercials and documentaries.

She recently wrapped production on the queer revisionist history series WHILE THE MEN ARE AWAY with director Elissa Down, which will screen as part of the Berlinale 2024 program. Meg was the setup DOP for *Ten Pound Poms*, working with director Jamie Stone.

Previously, she has shot Nakkiah Lui's dramedy *Preppers* with producers Liz Watts and Sylvia Warmer. She previously shot the 2021 Emmy winning, 2020 Rose D'or winning and AACTA nominated television series *First Day* with director Julie Kalceff and producer Kirsty Stark. This series was lauded internationally for its portrayal of transgender student Hannah Bradford.

Meg has shot many short form projects with some of Australia's most respected directors - two of which she won ACS Silver Awards for; Marcia Hines music video *Remedy*, directed by Russell Crowe, and the AACTA-nominated short film *I Want to Make a Film About Women* directed by Karen Pearlman.

Meg has also worked extensively in documentaries, and holds a BA in Media Arts and Production from the University of Technology. She is the recipient of ACS Drew Llewelyn Camerimage Scholarship and inaugural recipient of the Screen Australia Onbass Fellowship, which enabled her to attend the American Film Institute Conservatory under full scholarship.

Production Designer - JOSEPHINE FORD

Jo Ford's career as a Production Designer has spanned several decades.

The creative complexity of heading a collaborative design team, whose job it is to bring three dimensional worlds to life, that can then be inhabited by the director and actors, to tell a story for audiences to enjoy, is endlessly challenging and an inspiration for Jo.
