

Capgemini helps Group Thermote & Vanhalst (TVH) with migration to Google Apps

One of the biggest “cloud” deals of 2012 in Belgium

Diegem, 21 december 2013 – Capgemini Belgium, part of the Capgemini Group, one of the world's foremost providers of consulting, technology and outsourcing services, helps 1.600 employees of Thermote & Vanhalst (TVH), an international company with headquarters in Waregem (Belgium) and one of the market leaders concerning fork lift trucks, with the migration to Google Apps.

TVH will completely migrate all of its mail traffic to Google Apps. Employees of TVH in Australia were already using Google Apps, now they will be joined by 1.600 colleagues. Over time all other employees of TVH will follow, meaning that in the end over 3.000 mail-accounts will be transferred to Google Apps. That makes this one of this year's biggest “cloud” deals in Belgium.

The project will start shortly and will be followed by training sessions for management and employees early 2013. The “go live” of the project is planned for march 1st, 2013. Management of the Google licences will be handled by Capgemini.

Chief Business Innovation Officer Kalman Tiboldi of TVH: “Due to some recent acquisitions we are currently using several IT-platforms. The idea is to harmonize these. We chose Google to do just that and the expertise of Capgemini can help us realize our goals. Next to our e-mail and calendars, we will also transfer all of our internal documents (over 500 GB) to the cloud with Google Drive.”

Johan Nagels, Solution Manager Cloud & Mobile at Capgemini Belgium: “This deal proves the strenght of Capgemini in cloud computing. We have many competent specialists who can handle big projects like this and we expect to implement more large cloud projects like this one in the future. Customers are more and more convinced about the advantages that cloud computing can have for their business.”
