

Fort Worth 150th Anniversary of Juneteenth June 19-21, 2015 Fact Sheet

- Juneteenth commemorates when the slaves in Texas finally got word of the Emancipation Proclamation issued by President Lincoln. The historical significance affects not only African Americans in Texas, but also the many others who have stood for racial equality nationally and around the world.
- Juneteenth is a multicultural experience that touches the lives of a diverse audience. The annual attendance for the Fort Worth events has been recorded at more than 20,000 including participants, vendors, and spectators.
- Honorary Chair for Fort Worth's 150th Anniversary of Juneteenth is Texas State Senator Wendy Davis.
- Planned activities for the anniversary year include a Health and Financial Freedom fair in April and May leading up to the June events.
- Juneteenth weekend (June 19-21) activities include a Miss Juneteenth Pageant, Parade, 5K Walk/Run,
 Outdoor Festival with children's area, live music stage, car show, food trucks, vendors, Art Exhibit, and 3on-3 Basketball Tournament. Other activities include a film festival, Breakfast of Prayer & Ecumenical
 Service and a Gospelfest Choir Competition.
