War On Waste

Craig Reucassel is on a mission to uncover how much waste we produce as a nation and to learn how, together, we can all do something about it, when he presents the thought provoking three-part documentary series **War on Waste**.

No stranger to confrontation, over the series Craig takes on the big supermarkets, challenges Australians to reduce their waste, discovers what really happens to our recycling, and uncovers some shocking truths about Australia's wasteful fashion industry.



Can we, as a nation, force big businesses to waste less? Can we *all* do a little bit better?

In the 1960's, Australians were considered amongst the best in the world when it came to the ways they dealt with waste. Many recycling programs – especially those involving paper and newspaper – were pioneered in Australia. But in recent decades, the combined effect of consumer demand, supermarket policies and cynicism about the effectiveness of waste and recycling campaigns has seen a surge in the volume of waste we produce as a nation.

Craig takes a critical and first-hand look at household, retail and farming waste in Australia and asks, what has changed in the Australian psyche, and in our consumer culture, that has led us to become among the most wasteful nations in the developed world? We'll ask why Australians are generating millions of tonnes *more* waste every year – in food, fashion, packaging, electronics and more. We'll discover the truth about where various kinds of waste actually end up, and learn what we can do to reduce the staggering volumes we produce.

**Are all ice users junky scum?
Have you had 'ice rage'?
Does ice fry your brain?**

Over the past few years, Australia's 'war on drugs' has turned its attention largely to ice. In this episode, we talk to ice users, both past and present, to find out what the attraction to this drug is all about.

Describing the feeling of taking ice, Adam who is currently in rehab for his addiction, says *"Instant rush. You're as strong as ten men. You've got the energy, you're up and go. But it scatters you."* When asked what it's like having sex on ice, Olivia Jayne from Melbourne reveals, *"It's absolutely out of this world fucking amazing. When I decided that I wanted to get off the ice, that was the one thing that my ego held onto."*

Asked if they have ever experienced ice-rage, Marcus from Perth says *"I had psychosis, looped out. I thought people were chasing me with guns through the city. I was running up the street with a bag on my head. It was just all in my head."* Olivia describes how the one regret she has in life is verbally hurting people, *"I've been known to turn into a psycho. I become quite vicious. I would lash out at people. I would yell and I would scream and I would just attack them. Very nasty."* she says.

When presented with the question, 'Would you take it again?' recovering user, Zachary Penrith-Puchalski from Melbourne says *"Probably, if I felt like it. I don't believe in abstinence. I believe in learning how to control what you're doing, and learn restraint. If I decide to use again, I decide to use again."*
