- 3. Use the latest features in KBC / CBC / KBC Brussels Mobile like the ability to:
  - Pay for parking through the 4411 service
  - Add a Monizze card and check your meal, eco and gift voucher balances on the go
  - Block your credit, debit and/or prepaid cards using a direct link with Card Stop
  - Change privacy preferences to give or refuse certain third parties access to financial information regarding your current account
- 4. Ask the Alexa digital assistant for your account balance
