Cleverman

A young boy playing soccer has his heart ripped out of his chest by something other worldly. This plays perfectly into Minister Matthews' hands, who uses this as the basis for a story about how volatile and violent Hairymen can be.

Koen, looking for answers, heads into The Zone to find Aunty Linda, the woman who raised him after his parents were both killed in a hit and run accident. As he hugs her



in greeting, he gets a vision of her undergoing medical treatment for breast cancer. She, in turn, sees his one blue eye and realises he has been given the Cleverman powers – she knows how distressed this will make her son, Waruu.

Waruu, meanwhile, is in consultation with Harry, his unofficial second. Harry has surveillance photos of suspicious, unmarked semi-trailers heading into an old abandoned prison. Harry wants to raid the complex, but Waruu urges caution. And a political solution. He's going on TV – on a station owned by Jarrod Slade, no less - to debate with Minister Matthews.

Waruu starts strongly in the debate, skewering Matthews about the fact many Hairymen are disappearing without a trace, distressing families. But the interview is interrupted with a highly inflammatory report on the brutal death of Cameron Wells, the young soccer player, laying the blame squarely at the feet of Hairymen. Waruu has been outplayed, and is furious. Matthews, on the other hand, is delighted.

Djukara, the son of the Hairy family captured by the Containment Authority, is refusing to bow to the authority of the guards. His relief in discovering his father is captive in the same place is short-lived, when his father refuses to countenance any form of fighting back. Boondee's approach is to submit, knowing the Hairies will outlive their captors. But Djukara refuses to co-operate, leading to the guards torturing Boondee in front of him, and then shaving all of Djukara's hair off, as a warning to others about insubordination.

At first the Cleverman powers are a bit of a joke between Koen and his friends – if he cuts himself the wound heals in front of their eyes. But things turn serious when he is plagued by a voice in his head, calling him. The voice leads him and Blair to a mysterious laboratory, where they find a woman strapped to a table, full of tubes. They rescue her – and flee the lab – only for Koen to discover that this strange woman is something magical.

With YouTube over ten years old, vloggers now sell out stadiums and have fanbases boy bands would kill for. Jim Chapman, himself a superstar vlogger with a quarter of a billion views of his videos, takes us behind the scenes of the biggest vloggers on the planet.

Jim meets Tyler Oakley, whose vlogs have earned him an audience with President Obama. He hangs out with Ingrid Nilsen, whose 'coming out' video drew an audience



of twelve million and hears from her viewers about the impact it has had on them. He visits Alfie Deyes, who is now immortalised in wax in Madame Tussaud's alongside his vlogging girlfriend Zoella. Australian Story: 20th Anniversary Special 2-Part Special

Australian Story, ABC TV's multi award-winning documentary series, is celebrating its 20th year on air with a two-part special. Premiering Monday June 6th and continuing on June 13th the special will celebrate this enduring and hugely popular series, reflecting on the stories and faces that have featured in over 350 episodes.

For the past 20 years, the program has encouraged Australians from all walks of life to tell their stories in their own words. Some are public figures, such as Hazel Hawke, Malcolm Turnbull, actors Garry McDonald and Jacki Weaver, and sports stars Ricky Ponting, Anna Meares and David Pocock. Others are ordinary people facing extraordinary times: Gail Shann from outback Queensland, who's learned to live without use of her arms; the Damiani family, who are trying to find a cure for their sick child; and Barry Singh, the son of a banana farmer who dreams of conducting an orchestra. All provide insight into Australian life and the complexity and richness of the human experience.

Revolution School

In this episode the focus is on how to get the best out of students, be they high-achievers or strugglers in danger of dropping out. Year 11 student Rachel wants to get into medicine at uni so needs to be in the top 1% of students Australia-wide. Rachel's parents pressure her to perform, which causes her stress at home and school. They meet to try to resolve their differences, but Rachel's mum loses her temper. One of the students has been caught with drugs and it's a major dilemma for principal Michael Muscat.

Currently 25% of Australian kids don't complete Year 12 but Kambrya makes valiant attempts to keep students at school.

A special program, Darrabi, is set up for a group of teenage boys who don't fit in to mainstream classes. The boys are unruly and performing badly in all subjects so teacher Martin Macdonald and assistant principal Keith Perry plan a wilderness bush trek to build their self esteem.

NAPLAN, National literacy and numeracy testing, is held and Kambrya decides it needs to further improve its reading results. The school calls in literacy expert Di Snowball, who shows teachers a simple but effective method for improving literacy. At the start of each class, students must spend time reading a book. The kids love it, and the results are impressive.
