The Cry

Aftermath: Beyond Black Saturday

In February 2009, the worst bushfires in Australian history ripped through Victoria in a series of firestorms so powerful that a million acres went up in flames, seven thousand Australians lost their homes and 173 people lost their lives. Ten years later, **Aftermath: Beyond Black Saturday** chronicles the personal stories of the people who survived the Black Saturday infernos to discover how they coped with the unimaginable loss and trauma and how they picked up the pieces of their shattered lives.

While the 2009 Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission forensically documented the public response to the Black Saturday infernos, **Aftermath: Beyond Black Saturday** tells the intimate and often anguished personal stories of an ensemble cast of volunteer firefighters and local residents whose lives were turned upside down by the fires.

The ordinary people featured in **Aftermath: Beyond Black Saturday** all experienced the same extraordinary traumatic event, but each of them experienced it differently and each had to find their own roadmap through the wreckage that it made of their lives. By interweaving their stories, the film underlines how there's no sure-fire path to recovery from trauma, and no cheat notes to help piece the jigsaw of a life back together again.

As the ten-year anniversary of Black Saturday approaches, **Aftermath: Beyond Black Saturday** explores the long-term impact of Australia's worst bushfires by giving each of the featured survivors the opportunity to reflect on their personal road to recovery, and the chance to make sense of the unexpected trajectory their life has taken in its wake. This landmark documentary chronicles the challenging journey many Black Saturday surviors have been on in the decade since the firestorms transformed their lives. Out of the ashes of one of Australia's worst natural disasters, emerges a film not about death and destruction but about the tenacity of life and the extraordinary resilience of the human spirit.

But after 3 months of sharing dank motel rooms and sampling the parochial riches of what this wide, increasingly brown, land has to offer, McCartney and McLennan are well and truly ready to go home. They just need to get through one last broadcast before they can return to their loved ones and the private toilet situation that the Get Krack!n studio provides.

China Love

Just over 40 years ago, marriage in China was arranged by the state. Romantic love was seen as a capitalist concept and was not allowed during this period. Wedding photography (if any at all) consisted of one black and white passport photo of the couple (dressed in Mao-style outfits) as proof of the marriage.

Now, China has fallen in love with love and its exploding wedding industry is worth 80 billion dollars, and it is on an upward curve. Pre-wedding photography is one of the most significant and curious parts of the industry.

Every couple marrying in China will take part in a pre-wedding shoot. It involves several costume and backdrop changes where you can become a character in any fantasy you choose. For the most exotic locations couples pay up to \$250,000 AUD. Pre-wedding photo shoots have become an important national ritual. They are proof of the marriage but now also of love, romance, freedom, status, money and the new China Dream.

As an expat living in Shanghai with a long history of coming to China, Sinophile photographer Olivia Martin-McGuire was captivated by the construction of dreams through this booming photographic world. Once she started to delve deeper into this new tradition she found a unique window into China. One that revealed a country dreaming, a country rapidly booming and a country reconstructing its recent past trauma all through their own lens.

China Love takes us on a wild journey into the warmth of the family web in China, into the hearts of our characters and into their personal dreams with an understanding of why and where these aspirations come from.

The project explores China's new position as a globalised country from its restrictive and highly traditional past - through the window of its booming wedding industry and asks what is the new China Dream when it comes to love.

China Love takes us on a billion-dollar ride of fantasy exploring contemporary China through the window of the pre-wedding photography industry. The film is a feature length observational documentary which follows Chinese and Australian participants as they navigate love, weddings and family in the lead up to the most important ritual of Chinese society – getting married.



Back Roads – Finke

While Heather Ewart is in another part of the country, ABC journalist and presenter Joe O'Brien is in the remote Northern Territory community of Finke, traditionally known as Aputula. Every year, the tiny town's population swells from a couple of hundred people to around 6000 because of two big, but very different, events.

The town is famous for the Finke Desert Race, a 460 kilometre off-road endurance rally, one of the toughest in the world. **Back Roads** follows the fortunes of Australia's most famous extreme racer, current Rally World Champion Toby Price, as he attempts to win a record sixth Finke race on his motorcycle. Toby was the first Australian to ever win the gruelling Dakar Rally in 2016 and makes a point of getting to Finke almost every year. He is clearly a crowd favourite with the local aboriginal kids.

Joe also meets Toby's teammate and Alice Springs local David Walsh, who has been the "bridesmaid" runner up to Toby in the event twice before.

But there's another sporting event that unites aboriginal communities around the region – the Finke Sporting Carnival, with players and their families travelling for hundreds of kilometres to play each other in AFL and softball. It's a great catch for family reunions, who get a chance to watch the spectacle of the Finke Desert Race as well.

The huge annual influx of visitors guarantees one thing – more rubbish!

Finke was the 2017 Northern Territory Tidy Town winner, thanks to the hard work of council coordinator Gareth Lea and his team. They have set up a sophisticated recycling scheme to deal with the aftermath of the race and have encouraged the visitors to respect the community and recycle.

Local painter Justine Main's handywork can also be seen on large pots in the main street of the town and a gallery has recently been set up to sell the work of local artists, with half the proceeds going back into the community.

Finke is also considered one of the safest aboriginal communities in the Territory and it manages that without a permanent police presence.
