Four Corners

Final Episode of 2016

We all know Liz Jackson from her powerful *Four Corners* stories beamed into our living rooms for over two decades. She is brave, intellectually rigorous and possesses an ability to interview without par. Prime Ministers feared her, ordinary people opened their hearts. She changed the way we think on issues of national importance like Children Overboard, the Iraq War and the missing Weapons of Mass Destruction, the fall of Soeharto and implosion of East Timor, catastrophic floods, youth suicide, euthanasia, Aboriginal deaths in custody.



Her colleagues recognise her as one of the great TV journalists in our history.

When Liz was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease in 2015, she was devastated. Parkinson's is a neuronal disease that progressively diminishes the ability to perform essential motor functions such as walking, even eating. She learned there is no cure. To make matters worse Liz began experiencing daily pain and panic attacks that left her housebound for much of the day. She was embarrassed about her condition. She stopped seeing her friends so much and even tried to hide it from her children.

Her greatest fear is that she will lose the intellectual abilities she has relied on for her whole life – as dementia is often linked to Parkinson's.

Rather than be cowed by her predicament Liz has decided to employ her formidable skills to communicate to the world what it's like to go through Parkinson's – what it is, what hopes there are for a cure, what it means for her, for her family and friends.

It's a rare and precious gift to be invited into a person's private sufferings. More so when that person is well known to the public. With utter candour Liz will take us into a world difficult to understand. In true frontline reporting, she can describe in detail what it is like to be suffering pain and panic while it is actually happening. It's hard to overestimate how powerful and unique this is. We will be with her as she explores the often bewildering details of her condition and treatment during visits to her neurologist and psychiatrists. Through her eyes we will see the emotional evolution in her children and best friends as they respond to radical changes to her sense of self and dependency.

Most significant to Liz's story is her partner, Martin Butler, also a highly acclaimed filmmaker. Interweaving her contemporary story will be their fabulous life together – from radical children of the 70's living in palatial digs with the manager of The Who in Venice and squats in London to stellar globetrotting careers as journalists. The experiments with drugs, rock & roll, sexual freedom, children and demanding jobs have all been richly documented and explore two central themes: The nature of identity and the importance of loving relationships in times of need.

Are we a collection of our memories and experiences? Who are we when we can't operate in the world as we've always done? This is the deepest challenge to Liz and Martin's relationship. Liz will discover things about Martin she never knew and vice versa.

Intimate, poignant, entertaining, at times shocking but above all honest, this *Four Corners* story promises to be a landmark film of rare insight into the human condition.

Five young Australian filmmakers are firing their OPENING SHOT, with a fourth instalment of five half hour documentaries from Australia's next generation of documentary filmmakers.

This is the fourth season of OPENING SHOT, a vital initiative between ABC2 and Screen Australia that gives five filmmaking teams, all with a director under 35 years of age, the opportunity to create a prime time documentary film with a younger perspective that



further develops their filmmaking skills while also firing an OPENING SHOT into the national conversation. It's time for Australia's new generation of documentary filmmakers to fire their OPENING SHOT.

In *Big Bad Love*, comedian Becky Lucas recently found out one of her closest childhood friends had suffered years of violence and abuse at the hands of her partner. With young women 18-24 being most at risk of abuse, Becky sets out to understand what an abusive relationship looks like, how it begins and why it's so hard to intervene. She meets experts and psychologists to figure out how she missed the signs, conducts a social experiment on the street to see how the average bystander reacts to domestic violence, and seeks out the stories of young survivors to discover what anyone can do when confronted with domestic violence.

Humanoid synthetics have become an inextricable part of society, obediently serving, and protecting the human population. But what happens when these synths are given the right to consciousness and their own free will?

Series 2 of Humans picks up several months on from the events of series one, Niska (Emily Berrington) is still at large and in possession of the consciousness code. Her synth family, Mia (Gemma Chan), Leo (Colin Morgan) and Max (Ivanno Jeremiah), unaware of her location, are each trying to find their place in the world while Joe (Tom Goodman-Hill) and Laura (Katherine Parkinson) attempt to mend their marriage.

As unconfirmed reports of synths behaving inexplicably surface, the ripple effects of one simple yet seismic decision sees the past return dramatically and surprisingly to the door of the Hawkins house. Joe, Laura and the entire family are faced with a difficult choice that will put the family under an intense spotlight.

In the US, Milo Khoury (Marshall Allman), a young Silicon Valley billionaire, founder and CEO of a leading technology company is pioneering new research. Capturing the flavour of an ancient empire, chef Rick Stein embarks on a memorable odyssey through Italy, Croatia, Albania, Greece and Turkey during this new seven-part series.

In the U.K. it is estimated that one in four women will experience domestic violence in their lifetime, and the risk of domestic violence is highest for those between 16 to 24 years of age.

For entrée, Silvia is preparing marinated baby octopus and homemade potato bread, and she reminisces about long summers spent by the coast where she ate this dish. Doctor Gemma Foster (Suranne Jones) is a loving wife and a trusted doctor, but her seemingly perfect world is shattered when she suspects her husband of having an affair. Raped

White Ribbon Day Special

This UK film explores rape in a new and bold way: from forensic medical to police investigation, court and beyond.

Juliet was attacked by a stranger on New Year's Eve, while Kellie had known and trusted her attacker for over a decade. In 2012, St Mary's, the UK's leading Sexual Assault Referral Centre, allowed exclusive access: opening its doors to cameras as they supported Juliet and Kellie as well as over 1,000 other victims of rape seeking justice or attempting to move forward with their lives.

St Mary's Centre in Manchester was the first of the UK's 46 Sexual Assault Referral Centres. It is here, to the small all-female team of doctors, crisis workers and counsellors, that the police bring people who say they've been raped to conduct a forensic examination.

Rape is unlike any other crime. Often there are only two people present and if one person says it was rape and the other says it was consensual, the truth can be difficult to work out and almost impossible to prove. For the experts at St Mary's, it's not all about the conviction rate: rather they aim to give victims back their choice and control, whether or not a case goes to court.

Through the experiences of victims, as well as the specialists at St Mary's, Greater Manchester Police's Serious Sexual Offences Unit and the Crown Prosecution Service, this film offers a unique and hugely revealing perspective on rape in Britain today.
