Girls Change The World

ABC ME is leading the charge on the United Nations International Day of the Girl, Wednesday, October 11, as the ABC showcases a full day of entertaining and informative programming across TV and online that celebrates Australian girls of all cultures, abilities, ages and interests.

ABC's #GIRLSCHANGETHEWORLD campaign shines a spotlight on Australian girls and women who have taken risks, been rewarded for their intelligence, shown leadership, and driven social change at local, national and global levels that actively promote a better world.

Girls will take control of all the ABC ME platforms across the day with a stunning lineup of programs crafted by an impressive group of highly celebrated and emerging Australian female content makers. Fresh new faces of the future are presented for the first time, with 40 young female actors between the ages of 10-16 have been cast in these new programs.

The striking line-up of programs that celebrate incredible and powerful women and girls include:

• **Girls Change the World** – 4:30pm: This film is a 'how to' guide for girls about how to create change in areas of unfairness and discrimination in their lives, and in the lives of others. With help from young female activists championing a variety of issues, it will show girls that it's ok to be angry about injustice, and how to channel that anger into productive and powerful action. One girl can make a difference, no matter how big or small their effort, and they all have the potential to create positive change. GIRLS CHANGE THE WORLD!

• **Girls Film Season** – from 6.15pm: Five films selected as part of ABC ME and Screen Australia's joint initiative –

• Summer's Day: a film about the transition into womanhood when Summer gets her period for the first time and tries to make sense of her blooming body. Summer's Day is produced by Di Robertson, written and directed by Hattie Dalton.

• *First Day:* a story about the fears associated with the transition between primary school and high school - but in Hannah's case, the stakes are even higher: this year, she will be attending school for the first time as a girl. Produced by Kirsty Stark, written and directed by Julie Kalceff.

• *The Funny Ones*: four budding stand-up comics dream of a life as comedy performers, and get the chance to learn from some of Australia's funniest comedians. Created and produced by Belinda Dean and directed by Genevieve Bailey.

• Jaral in *Shame* struggles with the embarrassment of being a 12-year-old girl while trying to learn Noongar language to honour her family and culture. Created, written and directed by Karla Hart and produced by Paloma Bartsch.

• A Field Guide to Being a 12-Year-Old Girl, gives twelve girls the task of investigating their own species in an innovative blend of theatre and documentary. Produced by Katrina Lucas and written and directed by Tilda Cobham-Hervey

• Advice to My 12-Year-Old Self – screening throughout the day from 7.45am: During these 37 x 2 min shorts, amazing women who are achieving incredible things talk about what advice they would give to their 12-year-old selves.

Controversial writer Patricia Neville has finally returned to her old hometown, armed with a new novel that promises to excoriate Ballarat and it's many inhabitants – as evidenced by a book reading at the local library that quickly devolves into violence and chaos. But when she's found dead the next morning with her sister Eve unconscious beside her, seemingly part of some murder-suicide pact, Blake has to search out some truths about the place in order to understand how and why the woman died.

Blake will quickly discover all is not as it seems. Eve is a devout Catholic – so why would she try to commit the mortal sin of suicide? Why does Patricia's publisher, Angus Reed, seem so emotionally unaffected by his most successful client's murder? The Insider: Reggie Yates

New Three-Part Series

In this new three-part documentary series fast-tracked from the UK, Reggie Yates is back in jail a year after spending a week locked up – but this time he's a guard. Working inside Guildford County Jail in North Carolina, Reggie helps guard nearly a thousand prisoners – whose crimes range from minor misdemeanours to murder.

Reggie is also in the Middle East to spend a week living in the largest refugee camp in Iraq - alongside 30,000 Syrian refugees. Since the war in Syria began, nearly 11 million people have fled their homes in search of safety. The news has been dominated by those trying to cross into Europe, but some five million people ended up in refugee camps.

And Reggie heads to Ghana to live on one of the largest e-waste dumps in the world – Accra's notorious Agbogbloshie. Working with a group of "burner boys", the people grafting at what is considered to be the bottom of the ladder, Reggie discovers first-hand what life's like for the people who eke out a living on the site.
