James Norton and Robson Green will return as the unlikely 1950s crime fighting duo, Vicar Sidney Chambers and Police Inspector Geordie Keating, in Grantchester, based on The Grantchester Mysteries by James Runcie.

In the third series of Grantchester, new Archdeacon Gabriel Atubo reminds Sidney (Norton) that as clergyman he must put duty above his own needs and lead by example. Given the strength of his feelings for Amanda (Morven Christie), is this something that Sidney can do?

On the face of it, Geordie (Green) is still happily married to Cathy (Kacey Ainsworth). But there continues to be an undeniable spark between himself and feisty police secretary Margaret (Seline Hizli). Leonard (Al Weaver) was left heartbroken after Daniel (Oliver Dimsdale) left him for another man, but in this series he appears to put this behind him and find romantic happiness with someone else. But will those around him allow him this happiness?

Life and Death Row

A look at capital punishment through the eyes of young people whose lives have been shaped by it, including interviews from those on death row and their families.

The 2014 murder of 18-year-old Justin Black in Ohio led to the arrests of 19-year-old friends Austin Myers and Tim Mosley, who then gave different stories to the police after being arrested. You Can't Ask That

Not many groups of people in Australia are more feared or misunderstood than refugees. In this episode we hear from refugees about their experience of Australia. The people, the culture and their new home.

Addressing people's choice to 'queue jump' and come to Australia by boat, Atong Atem who arrived with her mother by plane on a humanitarian visa, says "I feel like if I was in the position of my family...and there was an option to get to Australia in six months instead of waiting for six years, I would do that." John Gulzari who arrived by boat in 1999 says, "Put yourself in my shoes, if your family is being threatened, if there is a disaster or a war, would you think 'is this legal or illegal? Oh, let me fill out the form'. When your life is hanging in the balance, you don't think about legal or illegal."

When Yaser Naseri fled Iran he attempted to come to Australia via people smugglers. The boat sank and only 47 of the 250 people on board survived. Confronted with the question, 'You come from a violent backwards country aren't we right to be scared of you?' he responds, *"You have to separate government from the people. People who come here, who live in countries that are in war, they are not the government and they are not terrorists."*

Morteza Poorvadi spent 4 years in Australian detention centres. While in detention, he sewed his lips together to protest the treatment of detainees. When asked, 'There's barely enough jobs and welfare for Australia why should we look after you too?', Morteza addresses all Australians, *"If you become unemployed, the government is there to help you. And you know what mate, my taxes are paying for that. And I'm glad."*

River

With his career and access to friend and colleague Stevie's (Nicola Walker) case resting on the outcome of his psychiatric report, River (Stellan Skarsgard) must keep his unofficial investigations into Stevie's death to himself.

This sends tensions high with his new partner Ira (Adeel Akhtar) who fears being dragged down by River's instability, and Chrissie (Lesley Manville), who needs River working on his own caseload, most pressingly investigating a suspicious workplace accident that has left a foreman fighting for his life.

Having discovered their affair, Lucien is blackmailing Adil (Akshay Kumar) to spy on Toby (Edward Bluemel). As he lies in bed, watching Adil get dressed, Toby is touched that Adil arranges to have coffee sent up for Toby, having worked through the night. But as he goes into the bathroom, a nervous and shamefaced Adil reaches into Toby's briefcase, absorbing every piece of information he can...

Betsey (Kara Tointin) catches the eye of a charming handsome man who insists she have a drink with him. Sonny (Sope Dirusu) has to intervene, and the incident is on the surface dealt with in a civil manner.
