



FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I got an email from an old friend a while back who shared "I've been doing this therapy and I'm supposed to look at pruning my relationships. Start cutting people out of my life. I wanted you to know that you're not on the brush pile yet but your branch is definitely being examined."

My reaction to this note was outrage and hurt. Which soon turned to delight as I realized that this woman was doing exactly what I wanted to. I'd been toying with the idea of pulling up anchor on my friendship for a while. And not because some trendy therapist told me to, but because since I've had children and a career and a husband and a falling down character home, volunteer commitments etc, etc, I am overwhelmed with the responsibility of having so many people in my life. Too many chats, and outings, phone calls and invitations. Too many surprise 50th birthday parties and progressive potluck dinners.

I used to talk to most of my friends several times a week but now I forget until I trip over them in my contact list, Facebook or at some goat cheese centered function every 2nd year. "I've missed you. We really should get together." And I mean it because we've shared years of history and layers of intimacy. Shared things that fuse people for a lifetime like apartments, eating disorders and boyfriends. But the planned luncheon gets moved because of a work schedule or biopsy, then put off until "after the holidays" and finally just doesn't happen. My friendship has become a guilt filled galleon. Thus began Taking Off. I am so grateful to the brilliant Jimmy Tait and Michael Shamata, Ivan Habel and the entire staff of the Belfry Theatre who have supported me through the process of writing this show. The Belfry is a wonderful place for an artist to feel at home.

Deb Williams is a multi-award winning actress, producer, playwright, comedian and one of the creators of the *Mom's the Word* plays, the latest installment of which is opening in Vancouver this April. Deb has been the Belfry's Associate Artist for the past three seasons, and she was last on the Belfry Mainstage as Sonia in Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike. She is the co-creator, producer and host of The Flame in Vancouver, a monthly storytelling event, TV special and radio show. Deb launched the successful Victoria incarnation of The Flame three years ago, which she facilitates and hosts semi-annually, in conjunction with story-telling workshops. This season, Deb was Michael Shamata's assistant director on Mom's the Word, I Think I'm Fallin': The Songs of Joni Mitchell, and his Soulpepper production of A Christmas Carol. Next season, she will make her professional directing debut at Carousel Theatre in Vancouver. For the past 30 years, Deb has worked on stages across Canada, is a Studio 58 grad, a community activist, event planner, gardener, knitter, a wife and proud mother of a couple of wonderful adults.

Director

At the Belfry, Jimmy has been a part of 21 Ways to Make the World Last Longer (Director/Co-Playwright/Actor), Helen's Necklace (Director), The Life Inside (Director/Playwright), Half Life (Director), and The Hostage (Actor). At the Canadian College of Performing Arts, he has directed Our Town, Marat/Sade, Six Characters in Search of an Author, Zorba, and he directed Joan for Theatre SKAM. In Vancouver, he received a Jessie Award for Best Director for Crime and Punishment and one for Best New Play for Devil Box Cabaret. Next spring, he will direct his new play The Explanation for the frank theatre company at The Cultch. He is grateful to Michael Shamata for the opportunity to work with Deborah Williams on her beautiful play with this beautiful team and to be back at the Belfry.



Carole Klemm Set Designer

Carole is delighted to be back designing for the Belfry Theatre and working with Jimmy Tait. Previous work here includes the sets for Helen's Necklace, Big Mama, Mesa, Trying, The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (Abridged), Skylight and Atlantis. Recent set designs elsewhere include Here for William Head On Stage and Social Studies for Prairie Theatre Exchange, Winnipeg. She has designed and painted sets for Manitoba Theatre Centre, Chemainus Theatre Festival, Theatre SKAM, Blue Bridge Theatre, Kaleidoscope Theatre, Western Canada Theatre Company, the New Play Centre, Studio 58 and others.



Erin Macklem *Costume Designer*

Erin is a French-Irish-Métis designer and playwright, and the Artistic Associate and Outreach Coordinator for the Belfry Theatre. She has been privileged to live on the traditional lands of the Lekwungen people since moving here to pursue her BFA in Theatre at UVic in 1994. Favourite past designs for the Belfry include *Urinetown: The Musical, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee,* and *The Valley.* She was part of the design team representing Canada in the international competition of scenography – The Prague Quadrennial 2015. *This Little Light,* her musical written with composer Brad L'Écuyer, premiered at the Belfry in 2016, and her next play, *Blue Beads & Blueberries,* was commissioned by Story Theatre Co. and will tour schools in 2017-18.



Bryan Kenney Lighting Designer

Bryan is a Vancouver-based designer and has worked across Canada doing set, lighting, and projection design. He is excited to be returning to beautiful Victoria and the Belfry once again. Recent credits for the Belfry include: This Little Light, Mom's The Word, Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike, Helen's Necklace and on the edge. Other credits include: Miss Understood (frank theatre), Faulty Towers, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, The Rocky Horror Show (Capilano University), Patron Saint of Stanley Park (Halifax Theatre for Young People), Trojan Women, Steel Magnolias (Douglas College), Boeing Boeing (Keyano Theatre), Anne and Gilbert: The Musical (Anne and Gilbert Inc), and Lion in the Streets (University of Victoria). Bryan is also an Assistant Lighting Designer for the Stratford Festival.



Malcolm Dow Sound Designer

Malcolm is an award-winning composer and sound designer, and is thrilled to be doing his first stint at the Belfry! Based in Vancouver, his work keeps him busy in the local theatre community, but he also tours as a musician, and writes and produces his own music, under the name Memoria Futura. Select theatre credits include: *Pericles* and the *Comedy of Errors* (Bard on the Beach), *The Graduate* and *Scar Tissue* (Arts Club Theatre), *Angels in America* (Studio 58), *Equivocation* (Persephone Theatre), *Selfie* and *Deux Ans de Votre Vie* (Theatre la Seizieme), *Of Mice and Men* (Hardline Productions), *Play with Monsters* and *After Jerusalem* (Solo Collective Theatre), *I Wish* and *Cat Killer* (Presentation House Theatre).

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


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
