

Now a doctor in her second year, it's Frankie's (Claire van der Boom) first day in a Renal rotation, where she wants to earn a permanent spot working under Renal boss, Chad Berger (Owen Teale), the very doctor who saved her life.

But for Frankie especially, a hospital can be a dangerous world. Though uniquely qualified to understand her patients as a transplant recipient herself, she is also vulnerable to infection, and her compassion for others may very well endanger her own life.

Frankie's best friend, Lou Tannis (Andrea Demetriades), is training to be a surgeon, but is confronting the limitations in her own cutthroat field, and the boys' club of surgical training teams. Will her fling with hotshot surgeon Rowan Mitri (Blessing Mokgohloa) help or hinder her progress? Female surgeon, Maggie Cutter (Susie Porter), is Lou's hardest taskmaster. But will she become the mentor Lou needs?

Meanwhile, Frankie and Lou's housemate Tabb (Arka Das) is on his first day as an intern, terrified that he won't stand up to the pressures, particularly when faced with his prickly, wounded-warzone cardio registrar Eli Nader (Liam McIntyre).

Frankie correctly diagnoses the mystery behind patient Zoe's (Melissa Bonne) symptoms: Zoe needs a new heart, but is soon in strife after sending Shawn (Daniel Amalm) home without his life-saving dialysis. Finding her courage, she goes above and beyond to get Shawn back into dialysis in time to get him a transplant.

But Zoe's donor heart is allocated to someone else, leaving her close to death. Berger warns Frankie that she's identifying too closely with her patients and it's blinding her to the realities of medicine: she can't save them all. He feels conflicted by the need to treat her as a doctor, and also as his patient. But after her dramatic first days Frankie is more determined than ever to make it in renal, to pay back the second chance she was given.

Utopia

Set inside the offices of the "Nation Building Authority", a federal government organisation responsible for overseeing



major infrastructure projects, *Utopia* explores that moment when bureaucracy and grand dreams collide. It's a tribute to those political leaders who have somehow managed to take a long-term vision and use it for short-term gain.

The award-winning series follows the working lives of a tight-knit team in charge of guiding big construction schemes from announcement to unveiling. Constant shifts in priorities are the order of the day as the staff are asked to come up with plans for everything from new roads and rail lines to airports and high rise urban developments. In short, *Utopia* examines the forces that go into creating a very well-designed white elephant.

Growing Up Gracefully

In this six-part docu-comedy series, twenty-something sisters Hannah and Eliza Reilly set out to road-test advice for women from the past and the present.

After rediscovering the 1950s teen-advice book *Growing Up Gracefully*, the Reilly Girls take on the six key milestones of growing up: Looking Your Best, Courtship, Sex, Making Friends, Career, and Spirituality, navigating social rules of a bygone era with those of the present.

Hannah the reckless party girl, adopts the ladies' etiquette of the past, and in the process, is grilled by 'Deportment Queen' June Dally Watkins, reforms into a 1950s medicated housewife for a day and brings her mother along on a first date. While dorky home body Eliza, following the advice for women dished up by the internet, learns how to get the perfect 'booty shot' from an Instagram model, gets Botox to preserve her youth and aligns her chakras at a new age women's spirituality retreat.

It's the rules for women of the 1950's versus the rules of 2017, Donna Reed versus Lena Dunham. And as good musical theatre nerds Hannah and Eliza wrap up each show with a big musical finale.

As the creators / writers / directors / sisters, the Reillys offer a uniquely millennial perspective. They have surrounded themselves with a team of amazing ladies, including Marieke Hardy as script supervisor and Series Producer Nikita Agzarian. There are actually so many women in the team, their periods have all synced, and together they are now unstoppable.

"We're following more advice than you can daintily poke a stick at," Hannah and Eliza said, "all to learn how to grow up gracefully, whatever the f*ck that means."

While co-hosting their community FBi radio show 'Girls Gone Mild' one Saturday morning, they got a phone call from Julian Morrow of 'The Chaser', and have been writing and developing with production company Giant Dwarf ever since. Hannah also currently hosts triple j's sex and relationships program 'The Hook Up'.

Prime Suspect 1973



The wait is over for the much-anticipated prequel to multi award-winning global hit *Prime Suspect*. Set in London in the 1970's the series follows the early career of the formidable DCI Jane Tennison, the role that established Oscar winner Dame Helen Mirren as a household name.

In this series, we meet Jane as an ambitious, single-minded 22-year-old probationary officer, starting out as a WPC in a world where chauvinism and rule-bending are the norm. Jane's dedicated, instinctive approach is evident from the start as she is thrown into a brutal murder enquiry, witnessing first-hand the devastating effects of violent crime, as well as experiencing tragic ramifications herself.

Immersed in the music, fashion and politics that defined a generation, we follow Jane Tennison as she establishes herself in a man's world, revealing the complexities of her ambition and personal life that shaped one of television's most iconic female characters.

In tonight's first episode, when the body of a teenage girl, Julie Ann Collins, is found in the underground car park of a Hackney housing estate, probationer WPC Jane Tennison (Stefanie Martini) becomes immersed in her first murder investigation. Sex in Strange Places

In this investigative series, presenter Stacey Dooley travels to Turkey, Russia, and Brazil to meet young people who are trading on their looks and sexuality for a living. The demand for sex is universal; the price paid by those who buy and sell is not. What do the attitudes of punters, police and the public towards the sex industry tell us about the places Stacey visits? From VIP call girls, flown first class and earning thousands of dollars a night, to street corners where every car that stops could carry a rapist or murderer, sex workers, brothel owners, and clients reveal the realities of working in this hidden and often dangerous world.

Stacey begins her journey in troubled Turkey. As the European gateway to the Middle East, it is a secular nation laced with conservative and religious attitudes to sex. Though the subject of sex is largely taboo here, surprisingly, on paper Turkey is the most liberal of the countries Stacey visits in this three-part investigative series. Prostitution is legal and there are even state-run brothels. Stacey meets sex workers who regard themselves as tutors to the uninitiated men of a sexually repressed society, preparing them for marriage. But even here Stacey discovers an overwhelming sense of terror pervades as she meets women who fear for their lives just for being seen talking to her. In a world where state registered prostitutes have 'sex worker' marked on their ID cards and will never be allowed to join the army, police or civil service, Stacey meets a brothel Madame and discovers that for many girls there's no way out.

For trans-sexuals the situation is worse. While Turkey is home to the biggest gay pride march in the Muslim world, according to the campaign group Transgender Europe, there are six trans-gender people killed in Turkey every year. Rejected by their families and with employers refusing to hire them, many are forced to live in an underworld of illegal brothels where armed gangs and corrupt police officers exploit each and every one. The war raging in neighbouring Syria has added an even darker, highly exploitative layer to this already stigma-rich business. Istanbul now has more Syrian refugees than the EU. War and sex-slavery go hand in hand, with many young Syrian girls and mothers forced to sell their bodies to make ends meet. Stacey braves the journey from Istanbul to Gaziantep close to the Syrian border where several hundred ISIS fighters are believed to live in hiding. Here she meets a young woman who was sold into sex slavery by ISIS fighters. Covered from head to toe in black she desperately wants to share her story but is so traumatised that she cannot stop crying. This is Turkey like you've never seen it before.

You Can't Ask That: Homeless

Most of us walk past homeless people on a daily basis. But how many of us really take a moment to stop and ask who these people are, and what it's really like not to have a place to call home?

Vicky Vacondios from Melbourne became homeless after escaping domestic violence. She had 10 minutes to pack a bag and flee with her children. When asked, 'What do you bums do all day?' Vicky says "Well I get up, get my children ready for school, take them to school, then I'd rush to a service to try to get some help and assistance ... trying to find a way out for my children and I. And then I'd pick up the kids and the first thing they'd ask me is 'Mum, have we got somewhere to sleep tonight?'"

After her divorce, Erika from Melbourne invested all the money she had into a pyramid scheme. She lost it all, including the roof over her head. When asked, 'Why don't you get a job?' "I'm 65. Retirement age." she says. "I was told by a 19-year-old when I went to a job interview that I was 'too experienced'. One lady was honest and said 'You're too old'."

Asked how long have you gone without a shower, parents of three Amanda and Tony from Perth respond, "My kids I try to shower every three days" says Amanda. "I've done a two-week stretch." explains Tony. "I don't keep track of insignificant things like that" laughs 50-year-old Rob Fitter who has been living rough in Sydney for 20 years. "I brush (my teeth) with food." he says. "I brush them with bong smoke" adds his mate Ricki Sargent.

When asked if being homeless is the worst thing that can happen to you, Rob responds, "Being homeless isn't that bad really. Not if you embrace the lifestyle."
