War On Waste: What's Changing

Have Australians changed the way they think about waste?

Earlier this year, presenter and provocateur, Craig Reucassel, put rubbish on our radar with the thought-provoking series **War on Waste**.

Now he's back, with a special follow up episode, screening Sunday 3rd December at 7.40pm.

War on Waste kick started conversations around the country about the staggering amount of waste Australians create every year. From food and fashion to the humble coffee cup, the series challenged pre-conceived ideas and forced Australians to change their behaviours, attitudes and habits.

While many Australians embraced the #BYOCoffeeCup movement, the battle is far from over when convenience store, 7 Eleven, confess that 70 million disposable cups are sold from their stores alone. They share their vision to combat the problem.

Craig started the #SizeDoesn'tMatter campaign and encouraged people to embrace imperfect produce to help reduce the amount of food waste happening on Aussie farms. In this episode he travels back to the banana farms for a surprising update. He also visits the major supermarkets to see how the groundswell of public outrage has encouraged them to shift their thinking about cosmetic standards and their responsibility around the recycling of soft plastics.

More than 17 billion plastic bottles and cans are consumed by Australians each year, Craig visits a glass recycler to show any doubters what happens to their kerbside recycling and finds out that one solution for better recycling is South Australia's Container Deposit Scheme. It's been running successfully for over 40 years and he questions why it hasn't been adopted in all States.

Craig sends a compelling message to the politicians, who are continually dodging the issues, including Victorian Premier Daniel Andrews about Victoria's recycling problems and he eventually tracks down the Federal Environment Minister, Josh Frydenberg, to find out why banning plastic bags is not a National issue.

War on Waste is compelling viewing for all Australians. It's been instrumental in raising awareness and fostering a better understanding of what individuals and communities can do to help the environment by reducing the amount of waste ending up in landfill every year.

Kiki and Kitty

The six-part series **Kiki and Kitty** follows the adventures of a young, black woman in a big, white world, where her vagina is a big, black woman AND her best friend.

Kiki (Nakkiah Lui) is a budding new lawyer, part of an Aboriginal graduate program at a 'progressive' Sydney firm. She's nervous and clumsy, hasn't yet made friends and her boss is cautious of her abilities. She's a good black girl who doesn't want to ruffle feathers, who constantly wants to please others, and who is uncomfortable and unconfident in her own body.

After a drunken night out, Kiki regains consciousness to find a strange woman straddling her.

Kitty (Elaine Crombie) sports a fuchsia party dress and heels, quaffs from a perpetual cocktail, and is the personification of Kiki's vagina. Kitty is here with a mission — to free Kiki from her self-limiting behaviours and to unleash her passions.

The journey to liberation will violently disrupt Kiki's life. Within hours, Kitty lands Kiki on unpaid suspension as she challenges Kiki to actively pursue what she truly loves. It's not long before Kiki lands a job at the nearby ice skating rink, managed by Bryce (Rob Carlton).

Kitty and Kiki create a list of all the things — the many, many things — that Kiki hasn't yet done. Kitty will guide Kiki through the items, Kiki growing in confidence as each is ticked off.

The list is populated with what Kiki sees as 'bad girl' things — seeing herself naked, doing drugs, shoplifting, and importantly, having an orgasm. Doing a runner, or at least an attempt to, introduces her to Rider driver Jack (Charlie Garber), who Kiki forms an immediate attraction to.

By the end of the raucous journey, Kiki will realise that she has a truly powerful voice, and a power that's rare.

Now in its third series, **Back Roads** returns to ABC TV introducing viewers to more of Australia's most interesting and resilient communities. These are towns full of colourful characters whose grit and good humour will uplift and inspire. In this nine-part series award winning journalist Heather Ewart uncovers more wonderful communities defined by their strength and humility. These Australians are as awe-inspiring as the landscape that surrounds them.

"They're proud communities like my hometown, full of surprises, fight and spirit", says Heather.

This series you'll meet 34-year-old Hunter McLeod, a former Melbourne commercial radio DJ turned pilot, who lives and flies in one of this country's most remote areas, South Australia's Oodnadatta track.

Keeping Australia Safe

Keeping Australia Safe is arguably the most ambitious observational documentary series ever undertaken in Australia. More than 24 government and private institutions granted privileged access for cameras to record their operations over the same 48-hour period. The entire 6-part series was shot in 2 days – revealing what it takes to protect our national and personal security while asking the central question: "What are the real costs?"

The busiest remand centre in Australia goes into lockdown when inmates charged with terrorism offences are brought down from the cells. In the Torres Strait, Border Force officers race to intercept a foreign fishing vessel skirting close to Australian waters. Deputy Chief Magistrate Jelena Popovic wrestles with releasing defendants into the community or whether to remand them in jail. Artsville: My Mother's Lost Children

An eccentric Jewish Australian family is thrown into turmoil when two stolen children reappear after 40 years. This is the story of Melbourne filmmaker Danny Ben-Moshe's epic family saga, spanning five decades and four continents.

At the heart of the story is Danny's quirky and loveable mother, Lillian. As a beautiful 15year-old, Lillian was a vulnerable girl from a poor immigrant family in the Yiddish speaking East End of London. Here, she drew the attention of an older and charismatic Iranian Jew, Raymond, and they quickly married.

By 18, Lillian was a divorced mother of two children, Michelle aged 2 and Andrew aged 3, living with her mother in 1950's London. One day her ex-husband, Raymond, took the children for an outing to the park. They never returned.

Danny had always known about his long-lost half siblings and assumed they would always remain lost. It was only when he became a father himself that he began to appreciate the enormity of what had happened and how so much of his childhood was affected by the events on one fateful day 60 years ago.

To discover the truth about his two lost siblings, and seeking closure for his mother who has lived with a lifetime of chronic depression, Danny begins a journey that leads him from his home in Australia to England where he grew up, the United States, Israel, and Iran to find out first-hand how this could have happened. In an emotionally-charged journey, Danny and his offbeat family unravel a web of secrets and lies as they attempt to put the past to rest.

Suddenly nauseous, Victoria (Jenna Coleman) makes a dramatic exit from a concert, only to discover she is pregnant. Her mother's unwanted medical advice only adds to her despair. Meanwhile, Lehzen (Daniela Holtz) bosses Francatelli (Ferdinand Kingsley) around about the Queen's specific dietary requirements for her condition.

When Victoria names Albert (Tom Hughes) as head of state in case of her death in child birth, the Tories are outraged by the `prospect of being ruled by a German prince. Albert, already desperate to have more influence, proposes a trip to the rapidly industrialising North in an attempt to engage with the country at large.

Whilst Victoria is dubious over Albert's desire to have more control, she nonetheless agrees to make a trip he proposes and leaves Harriet (Margaret Clunie) behind to keep the Duchess (Catherine Flemming) company. Francatelli takes the opportunity to spoil Skerrett (Nell Hudson), giving her culinary treats about which Skerrett offers useful advice on how to improve.

Far from the thrilling journey he anticipated, Albert is humiliated by his Tory hosts, the Giffards (James Wilby, Annabel Mullion) who suspect the Queen has come to promote Albert's regency. Peel (Nigel Lindsay) unexpectedly attends the shoot held by the Giffards and whilst Victoria is hostile to the Tory leader, Albert can't hide his excitement when Peel invites him to visit his railway.

Defying his wife, Albert sneaks out to take up Peel's offer and is amazed by the mechanical tour de force. He and Peel bond over their common interests. Alone and vulnerable, Victoria goes for a walk on her own and explodes at Albert for betraying her when he returns.

But curiosity gets the better of her and Victoria visits the train herself and marvels at the new invention. Albert ends up running alongside the train, and in an instant Victoria recognises that she has been no better than the antiquated Tories for denying Albert more influence.

Back in the palace, Francatelli and Skerrett are starting to fall in love and he cooks her an elaborate meal; while the Duchess warns Harriet about Ernest (David Oakes) and the danger of choosing a man over one's children. Realising that the Duchess feels she has made this mistake with Conroy (Paul Rhys), Harriet comforts the older woman.
