Who were don Bosco and Marguerite?

Saint Jean Bosco, a priest from Turin (1815 – 1888) devoted to the poor and abandonned youth, established the Salesian Congregation. Marguerite Bosco became « Maman Marguerite » by supporting her son's work year after years among the youth.

Main objectives & integrated approach

- ·A pedagogy focused on family reintegration.
- ·Hosting and identifying at-risk children.
- ·Systematic re-schooling of children.
- ·Access to professional and traditional training with certification.
- ·Help towards employment.

The Œuvres Maman Marguerite

Abandonned children and youth represent the core of the Salesians' mission.

In Katanga, particularly in Lubumbashi, there are hundreds of children, often from a very young age, ending up alone or with siblings in the street. Young adults in a similar situation can be found in thousands.

The Œuvres Maman Marguerite (OMM) network was established in 1994, to improve coordination among the fourteen centers or houses hosting children. The network centralises social and pedagogical data, helps finding resources necessary to take care of children, supports the centers in their efforts to manage funds and generate incomes.

The OMM network is recognised by the **Ministry of Social Affairs** as a **social NGO**.

Basic Principles
No discrimination.
Highest interest of the child.
Right to live and to survive.
Right to be listened

to and to participate.




14 hosting centers in and aroud Lubumbashi

Some 830 children including:

·450 interns:

All are children having been chased out from their homes, or chidren from dire social family conditions.



One child each day = 2\$

On average for **food**, **schooling**, **training**, **social assistance**, **medical care** etc.

- ·Organisation of **collections**.

The **Euvres Maman Marguerite** network is making large efforts to improve financial autonomy of the

improve financial autonomy of the centers that have potentials for it. Some of the houses will nevertheless remain heavily dependant on external generosity.
