

#### Amy Herzog Playwright

Amy won the 2012 Obie Award for Best New American Play for 4000 Miles (Lincoln Center). Her other plays include After the Revolution, Belleville, and The Wendy Play. She has had readings and workshops at Steppenwolf, Manhattan Theater Club, New York Stage and Film, Arena Stage in Washington, D.C., and Lincoln Center, among others. She has received commissions from Playwrights Horizons, Yale Rep, and Steppenwolf. Amy is a recipient of the Whiting Writers Award and the Helen Merrill Award. She is an alumna of Youngblood, Play Group, and the Soho Rep Writer/Director Lab. She has taught playwriting at Bryn Mawr and Yale. M.F.A., Yale School of Drama.

#### Anita Rochon Director

Anita is happy to be returning to the Belfry after a history of presenting work here with her company, The Chop (that she co-artistic directs with Emelia Symington Fedy). Belfry audiences may remember *KISMET* one to one hundred, Through the Gaze of a Navel, How to Disappear *Completely* or Pathetic Fallacy. She directs in a range of styles from classical texts to documentary work. She collaborates with some of the country's exceptional companies including the Shaw Festival, Electric Company Theatre, Bard on the Beach, Globe Theatre, Theatre Centre, Théâtre la Seizième and Vancouver Opera. She is a graduate of Studio 58 (Acting) and the National Theatre School of Canada (Directing). She is the recipient of the Ray Michal Prize for an Outstanding Body of Work by a New Director, the Siminovitch Protégé prize (awarded by Kim Collier) and a Mayor's Arts Award.



#### Peter Hartwell Set & Costume Designer

Previously at the Belfry: *Death and the Maiden, Red* and *Alice Munro Stories.* Peter has many design credits at the Shaw Festival, most recently, *Master Harold and the Boys.* At the Stratford Festival, most recently, *Long Day's Journey Into Night.* Peter has worked at theatres across Canada. In Great Britain he has worked for the Royal Court Theatre, the National Theatre, and the Royal Shakespeare Company. #### VocalEye

For patrons with low or no vision, we offer one VocalEye performance during each Mainstage production. Trained Audio Describers provide descriptions of the visual elements of the show, allowing people with low vision to enjoy the theatrical experience without missing any of the details.

#### **Hearing Assist**

For patrons who are hard of hearing, the theatre is equipped with an FM hearing assist system. We have 6 devices available through the Box Office.

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
