

Bullied

In schools around Australia, the issue of bullying is never far from the surface.

More than a quarter of Australian school students claim to be bullied on a regular basis, according to research cited by a joint Federal/State Governments anti-bullying program. Importantly, peers are present as onlookers in 87% of bullying interactions, and the way they respond - whether actively or passively - plays a central role in the bullying process.



Despite massive efforts by educational authorities to create awareness of bullying, and its impact on the targets of bullying, research indicates that the effectiveness of school anti-bullying measures are modest at best, and that bullying is likely to be an ongoing problem.

In the new series **Bullied**, presented by Australian sporting legend Ian Thorpe, the issue of bullying, and its causes, context and consequences will be examined.

Each story will chart the experience of an individual - along with their family - who is being bullied at school, and is seeking external help. The seriousness of their situation calls for a dramatic course of action. Supplied with hidden cameras, the individual will gather video evidence of their bullying.

With identities and voices masked, the footage is shown first to their parents, and then to their classmates as part of a voluntary group counselling session. The aim is to create an awareness of bullying - including among those who might inadvertently do the bullying - but also brings home its impact on the victims.

It aims to also help in the development of specific strategies to eliminate bullying in the future.

The ABC has partnered with ReachOut Australia and Kids Helpline to support a season of programming to tackle bullying. The aim of the season, headlined by *Bullied*, is to examine the causes, context and consequences of bullying in Australia today. Bullying affects people in different ways and can have serious impacts on mental health and wellbeing. Reflecting its prevalence in the community, ReachOut and Kids Helpline's information about bullying is accessed thousands of times each week, it's some of the most-accessed content on their services.

Cyberhate with Tara Moss

In this revealing and timely six-part series for ABC iview (and one hour version for ABC2) author, journalist, TV presenter and human rights advocate, Tara Moss will be our guide and guinea pig touring the darkest corners of the web to uncover the world of cyber violence. A social media user and advocate against cyber bullying, Tara tells her own story of dealing with online threats, anger, trolls and acclaim from Q&A to 'Lipstick-gate'. *Cyberhate* reveals stories of online hate from others in the public eye; opinion writers and celebrities and members of the



public who were unwillingly thrust into the spotlight through online vitriol.

Through interviews, discussion, and demonstrations, *Cyberhate* will investigate why fury is reshaping the online world. Will the Internet become a place where only bullies have a voice, or will civility and free speech reign online?

Along the way, Tara will take part in scientific and social experiments that will help explain what is it in our nature that has turned the Internet into a vehicle for hate, verbal abuse and violence. She'll guide us through the complexities of online ethics and digital democracy.

Each ABC iview episode and chapter of the feature length version is themed as we follow Tara as she lifts the cloak of anonymity to meet trolls and their victims as well as social media and cyber experts to understand the state of the online world and how online spaces impact everyone, in terms of safety, the law and freedoms.

My Year 12 Life

With the countdown to final exams underway, the journey of 14 Australian students continues tonight as they film the most important year of their lives.

At the start of 2016, the ABC and Princess Pictures launched an unprecedented television experiment. After scouring the country and watching hundreds of auditions, they gave cameras to a diverse group of 14 teenagers to film the most dramatic 12 months of their lives – Year 12.

The resulting 'vlogumentary' series is packed with emotion, hilarity, heartbreak and suspense – what will their Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) numbers be? What will they go through to achieve these results?

Pioneering a new form of storytelling, there were no film crews, nor producers on the ground, just 14 teenagers self-documenting their stories straight to camera in their own way. The resulting footage captures the raw drama of their final year of school, and reminds us how pivotal Year 12 is, what the future looks like at 18, and shines a light on how this has changed over the years.

Inspired by the serious stress the ATAR is putting on kids, this series aims to start a national conversation about the pressures of Year 12 and explores how our education system prepares young people to enter further studies or the workforce.

In each episode the students talk about the issues they're facing, including the pressure of the impending ATAR exams— and how they feel this will define their future; parental, cultural and school pressures; body image; stress and anxiety; and school and social life balance. The vlog diaries give the students an avenue to vent about these issues — their honest, candid, often humorous, and sometimes heartbreaking confessions will hit a nerve with all viewers.

Grand Designs

Can you really build a 'Grand Design' when you've only got £500 to start with? That's what Simon and Jasmine Dale had in the bank when they started to build their unique three-bedroom family house high up in the hills of rural Pembrokeshire.

They have their own take on 21st century low-impact self-building – foraged and recycled materials put together with infinite care and craftsmanship, not money. Despite the limited budget, their house will be open plan, have underfloor heating, an inside flushing loo, and a set of greenhouses that wouldn't disgrace Kew Gardens.

That in itself is a tall order, but they are also part of a pioneering, government backed, sustainable village called Lammas which has a fierce planning condition attached. In return for the right to build on open farmland they have to prove they can become self-sufficient on their seven acre plot within five years.

It's a huge double challenge. With sheer hard work, help from nearly 300 volunteers from all over the world and immense skill, Simon and Jasmine's house slowly rises out of the hillside. Along with the build, they struggle to hit the self-sufficiency target set by the council. The stakes are high - fail to hit the deadline and they won't be able to live in the house they've laboured over for years.

Mountjoy Prison

Mountjoy Prison is a brand new, hard-hitting documentary series that lifts the lid on life inside Mountjoy Prison, one of Ireland's largest prison facilities. Raw and unflinching, Mountjoy Prison offers a compelling insight into a world seldom seen, where drugs are the common currency and violence is a fact of life, but where hope sometimes finds a foothold. Filmed over the course of nine months, the series gets under the skin of this closed community, shining a light on the challenging and often dangerous work undertaken by prison staff and on the harsh reality of prison life for those behind the cell door. Through candid interviews and immersive, fly-on-the-wall footage Mountjoy Prison uncovers the hardship, humour, heartbreak and humanity on both sides of the bars.

In episode four: Gate Fever, the capacity crisis in Mountjoy Prison comes to an end, for now, but a prisoner death in custody poses complications for staff - and heartache for some prisoners. Over in the Training Unit, prisoner Conor returns from his period in Wheatfield Prison and awaits word on whether he will be eligible for early release. In the main prison, an emotional Officer Kelly prepares for his retirement from the job after 30 years of service. Over in Mountjoy West, staff have to contend with an unruly prisoner and a dirty protest in one of the cells. Prisoner Paul is heading to the Circuit Court to appeal his sentence. If he succeeds he could walk free a year early, but if his appeal fails, he fears his sentence could be extended even further.
