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Stacey Dooley Investigates: Canada's Lost Girls

Canada has a dark secret – the disappearance and murder over decades of more than a thousand-indigenous woman and girls. Stacey travels to British Columbia and Alberta to find out more about what some believe is a "national scandal". She begins on a remote road dubbed the 'Highway of Tears", where dozens of women have vanished or been murdered since 1980 whilst trying to hitchhike.

As a national enquiry is launched, it has emerged that there are cases across the country, but why do so many remain unsolved? Take 20-year-old single mother Amber Tuccaro, abducted and murdered in 2010. Stacey meets her family who feel there are still so many unanswered questions and no justice for Amber or for our other victims found in a six-mile radius.

The community have criticised a Police force that they accuse of failing to investigate indigenous cases properly – in the words of one elder "some of the biggest racists carry a gun, and they carry a badge". Stacey meets the police to ask what they are doing to address this issue and bring closure for the families of the missing and murdered.

Will Claire see the truth revealed or will the medical staff involved in the operation back the surgeon, Rowan Mitri (Blessing Mokgohloa), when he denies that a mistake was made?

Frankie wants her friend Lou (Andrea Demetriades) to speak out, but will she when her own future as a surgeon is at stake? But she's under pressure both from Frankie and senior surgeon Maggie Cutter (Susie Porter), who wants Mitri discredited for her own career reasons.

Thirteen

Blinking into sunlight, 26-year-old Ivy Moxam (Jodie Comer) stumbles out into the street, away from the cellar that's been her prison for the last 13 years. But escape is not the end of Ivy's story. It's just the beginning.

As she returns home, Ivy's parents try to hide their bitter separation from her, and are desperate to recreate the idyllic life she was wrenched from. She has a mother (Natasha Little) who can't confront the truth of those missing years; a father (Stuart Graham) torn between two versions of his life; and a sister (Katherine Rose Morley) who still feels hidden in Ivy's shadow. As hard as they try to be normal, it's obvious nothing is.

When Ivy is reunited with her first boyfriend, the intensity of adolescent love comes rushing back. She's picking up the threads of a life half-lived, but they're about to be pulled apart again.

Ivy's captor is on the run, and she isn't safe. Assigned to the case are DI Elliott Carne (Richard Rankin) and DI Lisa Merchant (Valene Kane). Their relationship is more than professional, but it begins to break down as Carne is drawn closer to Ivy.

Then cracks appear in Ivy's account of her ordeal, and they start to doubt her motives. Beneath her childlike façade, she's become a strong-willed woman. What happened to Ivy in that cellar? How has it changed her? And can she be trusted?
