Rosehaven Series Premiere

Written and created by real-life best mates and comedians Luke McGregor (*Luke Warm Sex, Utopia*) and Celia Pacquola (*Utopia, A Beautiful Lie*), *Rosehaven* is a new eight part comedy series set in rural Tasmania.

Luke McGregor is Daniel McCallum, who returns to his rural Tasmanian hometown, Rosehaven, to help his intimidating mother with her real estate business. He gets a surprise when his best friend from the mainland, Emma



(Celia Pacquola), turns up on his doorstep - on the run from a marriage so fresh her husband is still on their honeymoon.

In no time these two friends are thrown into the centre of small town life – Daniel, confronted at every turn by the ghosts of his adolescent past and a town that hasn't moved on. All the while his mate Emma is lapping up her anonymity in Rosehaven and newfound life on the lam.

Daniel's fearsome mother Barbara (Kris McQuade) has never needed him for anything. But backed into a corner with an injury she needs to undergo surgery for, Barbara has summoned Daniel across the Bass Strait to babysit the business – MaCallum Real Estate.

But Daniel has other ideas. He wants to take over the family business and prove to his mother that he has what it takes to succeed. But now he's also navigating the surprise arrival of his mate Emma. Emma is in no hurry to grow up, and a new town with no ties suits her far too well.

The real estate agent in a small town is at the centre of every crisis – births, deaths and everything in between that will have you upsizing, downsizing or moving on. And as the only agents in Rosehaven, soon enough these two best buddies Daniel and Emma will find both their friendship and their sanity put to the test by the charming, but deeply eccentric, townsfolk of Rosehaven.

Man Up

Gus Worland is on a mission to change our minds about what it means to be an Aussie man. The stereotypical Australian man is strong, sporty stoic and tough as nails. He laughs in the face of fear. And when life gets him down, he drinks a cup of concrete and hardens the f**k up. Or so the saying goes. But when we tear away these long-held notions of what it means to be a man, how is the average Aussie bloke actually faring?

Enter Gus Worland: son, husband, father of three and professional talker. Captain of Triple M's Grill Team ("the manliest show on radio"), Gus is a typical Aussie bloke who loves his sport, loves his family and loves his mates. Gus is steeped in the world of men and cares about the issues that affect them. But this series will follow him on an emotional and personal journey like he's never experienced before.

In 2006, Gus lost one of his best mates, Angus, to suicide. Angus was one of the 2000 men that take their own life in Australia every year – many of whom show little or no warning signs, sending devastating ripple effects through families, friends and society as a whole.

A decade on, Gus is still bewildered by the death of his friend, who always seemed so strong and charismatic. "He was a hero to me. This awesome, untouchable, always positive guy. The kind of guy you went to for answers." He can't understand why Angus didn't reach out for help.

As he looks to find out why, Gus discovers a frightening link between the stoic ideals of manhood that so many men struggle to uphold— and the unacceptably high male suicide rate in Australia. Is the pressure to harden up making men crack?

Two years have passed since Bess, an upper middle class doctor, discovered she was adopted and found her drag racing, biological parents living in the outer suburbs.



With her two families, the Brights and the Wheelers each now facing a brand new set of challenges: moving houses, illness and injuries, relationships ending and beginning, Bess struggles to manage her two families living at opposing ends of the freeway, with varying levels of success. Meanwhile, Brianna has found love and is eager to cement her relationship with her new fiancé, Younis, as a contestant on The Block, and Amber discovers that her expartner, Troy, is keen to cement his own new relationship. 


Mental As...2

The Not So Secret Life of the Manic Depressive: 10 Years On

In October 2016 ABC2 takes on the mantle of *Mental As* and puts the spotlight squarely on mental health issues facing young people today in **Mental As...2.**

Ten years ago, Stephen Fry first spoke about living with manic depression and began a national conversation about mental health.



Stephen gives us a privileged insight into the rollercoaster journey of what living with bipolar really means – he talks about his suicide attempt while filming in Uganda in 2012; how his busy lifestyle exacerbates his condition and his realisation that his condition can't be cured but only managed.

In this film, we see how different people of all ages deal with bipolar. We return to previous contributors and meet new ones – all of whom are coping with bipolar and learn of the effect that bipolar has on their careers, marriages and physical wellbeing.

Parent and child – for many of us it's one of the longest and most significant relationships we'll ever have – and we don't even get to choose! Jane Caro, mother of two daughters and grandmother to recent arrival Alfie, has often wondered what it would be like to parent a boy. In this special four part series, five brave families agreed to let Jane into their lives and homes to reveal the innermost workings of their relationship.

We meet two fathers and daughters: Warwick (88) and Melanie (59) who had a fraught relationship over the years but have now come to a place where Melanie can see her father as a vulnerable human being instead of a scary authoritarian; for Jason (46) and Patty (18), disability in the family means that Jason has been a very hands on dad.

The three mothers and sons are Helen (65) and Brett (34) who spent years guarding their respective secrets until a cathartic night of confession; Denise (64) & Alex (31) who learn surprising things about each other along the way and Val (49) & James (29) whose relationship was tested and cemented by grief.

Grand Designs House Of The Year

Series Premiere

Every year the Royal Institute of British Architects holds a competition to find the best new home in Britain and this time, *Grand Designs* is along for the ride. Presented by Kevin McCloud and guest reporters Zac Monro and Michelle Ogundehin, this four-part series explores some of Britain's most contemporary and cutting edge homes, all of them nominees for the prestigious RIBA House of the Year Award 2015.

Kevin and the team meet the owners and architects who built them, reveal how these exemplary houses were constructed and uncover the secrets of designing and building a truly inspirational home. From a house built over a river in Northern Ireland to a remote, renovated mill in Scotland and a bold, wooden shed in the eerie landscape of Dungeness, we take you behind normally closed doors to see some of the best new architecture in the UK. In the final episode Kevin will reveal the overall winner of the RIBA House of the Year.

In this first episode, Kevin McCloud visits five homes built for country living. Enormously varied in size and style, they include a house disguised as a giant shard of flint; a beautifully crafted timber farmhouse in Somerset; a low budget home made of shipping containers in Northern Ireland; an elegant eco house in Cambridgeshire designed for a passionate birdwatcher, and a stunning modern glass villa with a spectacular jagged roof designed to look like mountain peaks.

Silvia's Italian Table

Artist Ken Done, comedian and author Magda Szubanski and chef Matt Moran join Silvia at her table as they talk all things 'family'.

For entrée, Silvia has chosen her favourite simple pasta dish – homemade spaghetti with a cheese and pepper sauce. We see her in Rome, sitting down to the classic cacio e pepe. Silvia shows how two ingredients – grated pecorino cheese and cracked pepper – turn a simple dish into a tasty treat.

As everyone relaxes Ken makes the pasta dough, he talks about how the prospect of seeing naked women enticed him to go to art school as a teen; while Magda re-enacts an iconic movie scene. Meanwhile Matt takes on the role of 'dish pig'.

For the main dish, Silvia cooks Ligurian-style lamb shanks. She visits an olive farm in Liguria to talk about her favourite olives – the ones she'll be using. As they settle into the meal, the conversation turns to meatier subjects: Matt talks about his relationship with his father and how it's influenced his relationship with his own children; Magda talks about her Polish background and her father's fight against the Nazis during WW II; and Ken opens up about his early years while his dad was away at war.

For dessert, Silvia uses inspiration from a visit to a delicatessen in Milan to try out some stuccolo, and the guests shift back into the kitchen while they make this Italian-style strudel. Over dessert Matt and Magda reveal how they found their partners, before they bid arrivederci – except for Matt, who has to do the washing up!

Home Fires Series Premiere

It's August 1939, and Britain is on the brink of war, and the inhabitants of Great Paxford are preparing to fight Germany yet again.

Butcher's son David Brindsley (Will Attenborough) gets the all clear from Dr Will Campbell (Ed Stoppard), and announces his intention to enlist as soon as he's 17. His mother Miriam is devastated, and tries to persuade Will to declare David medically unfit. But Will himself plans to rejoin the army, and his wife Erica (Frances Grey) is less than thrilled, as he served in WW1, and they now have two daughters, Kate (19) and Laura (18). But he fails the medical because of an irregularity in his breathing.

President of the WI, Joyce Cameron's deciding vote closes its doors, and Frances Barden is furious and is determined to resurrect it - the blackberries on the hedgerows around the village can provide jam production - a way of raising money for the war effort and recruiting new members. Whilst picking, postman Spencer Wilson (Mike Noble) brings Claire Hillman's (Daisy Badger) bike, which he has fixed, back to her and there is an obvious attraction.

Whilst Pat (Claire Rushbrook) is out with the WI, her husband Bob (Mark Bazeley), a writer and manipulative bully, is rushed to hospital with severe food poisoning. Pat thinks she has made him ill with bad fish, and when Bob returns from hospital he's determined to make her life hell.

At a jam sale the next day, the women try to persuade local farmer Steph Farrow (Clare Calbraith) to join their new WI, but for her it's a world away from her practical farming life. Blonde bombshell Jenny (Jodie Hamblet) arrives and whisks Spencer away for a drink, and Claire's hopes are dashed.

As the women wait in the village hall for new members to turn up, Joyce arrives and rejoices at their failure. But just as they're giving up, Steph appears with a trailer-load of women.
